Significant Legislation

- SB243 (S. Smith/A. Hickey) – Revises provisions relating to DNA
 - Effective 7/1/2013
- SB 38 (DPS Records Bureau) – Revises provisions governing dissemination of CHRI relating to certain offenses
 - Died in Committee.
- AB 30 (DPS Records Bureau) – Revises provisions governing the NV SOR website
 - Effective 5/24/13
- SB 45 (DPS Records Bureau) – Revises provisions governing the sealing and removal of certain records of criminal history
 - Effective 7/1/13

Significant Legislation Cont.

- SB 502 (Dept. of Admin.) – State Health Division’s bill to align with the Affordable Care Act and allow the Repository to retain applicant prints to notify health facilities & the Health Division of subsequent criminal convictions of current employees
 - Effective 7/1/13
- Multiple statutes governing expansion of criminal history background checks for employment/licensing purposes

MTG Records Quality Audit

- Records Bureau received a federal grant in 2012 to conduct an independent audit of the completeness, accuracy, and timeliness of criminal history records housed in the Repository.
 - Recommended in 2011 Disposition Study & 2012 NCJIS Modernization Study
- Current internal figures estimate only **44%** of Nevada arrests have a disposition on file.
- MTG Management Consultants retained through competitive bid process to conduct the audit.
- MTG has completed its sampling for selected Nevada law enforcement agencies.
- Currently sampling records from selected Nevada courts.
- Final report due to the Records Bureau in March 2014.

Dissemination of FBI CHRI

- Criminal Purposes

- Governed by the FBI CJIS Advisory Policy Board
- Have to meet definition of criminal justice agency (28 CFR Part 20)
- No sharing restrictions between criminal justice agencies for criminal justice purposes
- Security, Tracking, and Audit Requirements

- Civil Purposes

- Governed by National Crime Prevention & Privacy Compact (42 USC § 14611-14616)
- Follow Public Law 92-544 and 28 CFR § 50.12; 28 CFR Part 20
 - State statute or local ordinance approved by FBI
 - For licensing or employment purposes
 - Only for purpose requested
 - Fingerprint-based
 - Results only to Governmental agency
 - Security, Tracking & Audit Requirements

- Pictorial description of what's included in NCJIS Modernization
 - Which applications and approximate time frame
 - Tie-in to dispositions, NOCs
 - Where we are with Initiative 2 (infrastructure) modernization
