

NEVADA COUNTIES





The Sixty-Sixth Session of the 1991 Nevada Legislature created the Uniform Crime Reporting Program within the Central Repository.

NRS 179A.078 Uniform Program for Reporting Crimes:

Establishment and purpose:

The Director of the Department shall establish within the Central Repository a Uniform Program for Reporting Crimes that is designed to collect statistical data relating to crime or delinquency of children and to facilitate the collection and analysis of statistical data relating to crime at a central location. (Added to NRS by 1991, 824; A 1993, 362; 1997, 454; 2005, 903)

NRS 179A.075 Sections 2, 6 and 7 mandate the reporting of criminal justice statistics to the Central Repository and the submission of that data to the Federal Bureau of Investigation and the Governor of Nevada.

Excerpt From NRS 179A.075

- 2. Each agency of criminal justice and any other agency dealing with crime or delinquency of children shall:
- (a) Collect and maintain records, reports and compilations of statistical data required by the Department; and
- (b) Submit the information collected to the Central Repository in the manner approved by the Director of the Department.
 - 6. The Central Repository shall:
- (a) Collect and maintain records, reports and compilations of statistical data submitted by any agency pursuant to subsection 2.
- (b) Tabulate and analyze all records, reports and compilations of statistical data received pursuant to this section.
- (c) Disseminate to federal agencies engaged in the collection of statistical data relating to crime information which is contained in the Central Repository.
- (g) On or before July 1 of each year, prepare and present to the Governor a printed annual report containing the statistical data relating to crime received during the preceding calendar year. Additional reports may be presented to the Governor throughout the year regarding specific areas of crime if they are approved by the Director of the Department.
- (h) On or before July 1 of each year, prepare and submit to the Director of the Legislative Counsel Bureau for submission to the Legislature, or to the Legislative Commission when the Legislature is not in regular session, a report containing statistical data about domestic violence in this State.
- (i) Identify and review the collection and processing of statistical data relating to criminal justice and the delinquency of children by any agency identified in subsection 2 and make recommendations for any necessary changes in the manner of collecting and processing statistical data by any such agency.
 - 7. The Central Repository may:
- (a) In the manner prescribed by the Director of the Department, disseminate compilations of statistical data and publish statistical reports relating to crime or the delinquency of children.



The **Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR)** Program is a nationwide cooperative effort of over 17,000 city, county, and state law enforcement agencies reporting data on crime. The monthly contributions to Nevada's current program, with 38 local law enforcement agencies reporting, represent a solid beginning in establishing an effective statewide criminal justice information system (CJIS). We invite remaining non-participating local law enforcement agencies to join their peers in this effort and to participate in this important program.

Ideally, UCR data will eventually merge with that of the other major components of the criminal justice system (i.e., prosecutors, courts, and corrections) to form an integrated system for the exchange of vital management information. The availability of such data will enhance law enforcement's proactive response to crime and justice in Nevada. The Nevada Department of Public Safety administers the UCR Program as a statewide, standardized method of collecting statistics on crime as it is reported to law enforcement. The UCR program also produces a reliable set of crime statistics for use in law enforcement administration, operation, and management. Additionally, Nevada's statistics are forwarded monthly to the FBI for inclusion in its annual report *Crime in the United States*.

We hope UCR data will be used over the years as a leading social indicator. With this annual report, Nevada's citizens can look to UCR as the primary information source on the nature and extent of crime in Nevada. Criminologists, sociologists, legislators, state and local planners, the media, and academicians can use the statistics for wide and varied research, planning, as well as for other applications.

CRIME FACTORS

Statistics gathered under the UCR Program are submitted by the participating law enforcement agencies of Nevada and represent a spectrum of crime on statewide, county, and municipal levels. Awareness of the presence of unique variables is necessary if fair and equitable conclusions are to be drawn. These crime-influencing factors are present, to some degree, in every community and their presence affects, in varying degrees, the crime developments of the community. Comparison of crime figures between communities should not be made without first considering individual factors present in each community. Crime, as an outgrowth of society, remains a social problem of grave concern and the police are limited in their role as to its detection and suppression.

Following are some conditions that will, by type and volume, affect crime that occurs from place to place.

- Size and density of community population and the degree of urbanization in the surrounding area
- Compositions of population with particular reference to youth concentration
- Economic status of population, median income and job availability
- Relative stability of population, including commuters, seasonal, and other transient types
- Modes of transportation and area highway systems
- Climate, including seasonal weather conditions
- Cultural conditions such as educational, recreational, and religious characteristics
- Standards governing appointments to the police force
- Policies of prosecuting officials, the courts, correctional and parole/probation officials
- Effective strength of law enforcement agencies
- Attitude of the public toward reporting crime and participation in the prosecution of offenders
- The administrative and investigative efficiency of local law enforcement agencies, including the degree of adherence to crime reporting standards
- Organization and cooperation of adjoining and overlapping police jurisdictions

The primary goal of the UCR program is to identify crime and related problems. Statistics in this publication should not be used to measure or to evaluate workloads and results of individual contributing departments. While most police agencies are collectively viewed as crime-fighting units, considerable independent research shows only a small portion of the workload of many departments is spent fighting crime. Because of other assigned duties, the peculiar cycle of crime and clearances, and different community factors that normally affect crime statistics, no conclusions regarding individual departments should be made without consulting directly with the agency being analyzed.

Crime rates in this publication are based on the resident population of the state and its subdivisions as established and published by the Nevada State Demographer. Population estimates are revised annually. Seasonal population figures are too inaccurate and fluctuate too rapidly to be used in the determination of crime rates. Most Nevada communities experience rather wide seasonal population fluctuations due to the nature of the state's major industries, gaming and tourism. Accordingly, actual crime rates per thousand reported here may appear higher than might be expected for a community of comparable size without substantial fluctuations. This should not deter police administrators from using the data for planning and administrative purposes. Local seasonal population data is available which can be utilized for further statistical refinements.

Additionally, readers are cautioned not to make direct comparisons between crime rates reported for Nevada communities and those of communities of similar size in other states without first carefully analyzing and applying local modifying factors.

POTENTIAL USES OF UCR DATA

The Nevada program is unique among similar state programs as it is dedicated to doing more than just gathering statistics. The program is dedicated to providing statistical support services to its contributors and to producing a variety of reports, or crime profiles, on an as-needed basis. These crime profiles will set the stage for extensive use of the data by police administrators and other criminal justice agencies.

Persons reading this report may ask, "How good are Uniform Crime Reports and how can they be used?" Initial responses that come to mind may be limited, but as the information is examined more closely, many and varied uses are discovered. Foremost is keeping the public informed as to the volume and nature of crime, which they may judge and act accordingly. In actuality, UCR is a multi-faceted vehicle of many uses. Here are a few, but by no means all such uses, as they relate to different groups and agencies.

Law Enforcement Contributors

Administrative information relating to:

- Budget need and justification
- Staffing number needed relating to state average number of employees vs. population and crime rate
- Department composition Patrol, Administration, Jail, Laboratory, Detective Division, Juvenile
- Identification of specific problem crimes
- Disbursement of personnel and shifts in accordance with the crime picture of individual communities with avoidance of duplication of services in cases of concurrent jurisdiction
- Training according to crime problem prioritization
- Equipment procurement by justified need
- Selective enforcement by crime volume, particular times, and seasons through UCR information
- Crime Profiles identification of problems unique to individual communities
- Long-range Planning as anticipated by crime trends

Governor and Legislature

- Broad, accurate picture of crime in Nevada by location, volume, type, and rate, as reported and derived from records of all participating enforcement agencies
- Guide to validate funding needs of special interest groups and their requests for funding of the same
- Need for more or fewer specialized programs
- Identification of crime trends and their relationship(s) to training, courts, corrections, and other criminal justice agencies
- Identification of various social problems relating to drugs, alcohol, juveniles and rehabilitation
- Effectiveness of various social programs related to drugs, alcohol, juveniles and rehabilitation

Courts - Prosecution

- Valuable general research information on crimes within the areas being served
- Crime trend information
- Identification of specific crimes to be considered in the prosecutorial and judicial processes

Press

- A factual source for use in reporting crime and socially-related problems

Social Agencies

- Identification of problem areas for concentration of remedial activities
- Application for general evaluation of program effectiveness

Educational Institutions

- Educators at all levels can use UCR data for various studies, budget preparation, and planning.

The above listed are a few possible uses; undoubtedly many more exist. The larger the UCR database becomes, the clearer its value will become. Since effective problem solving begins with problem identification, UCR will continue to be meaningful for years to come.

Nevada UCR believes the data provided herein can serve as a catalyst for some departments to establish modern record systems for the first time. With other agencies it may spur needed system upgrades. This will enable administrators at the chief and sheriff levels to be able to take a renewed look at their departments, potentially effecting beneficial internal operational changes. Awareness by subordinate personnel that their reports and arrest information are being used, not just filed, will result in better and more comprehensive reporting. Finally, the periodic release of crime information to the general public will keep the crime problem in its proper perspective.

REPORTING PROCEDURE

In Nevada's UCR, contributing law enforcement agencies are wholly responsible for compiling their own crime reports and submitting them to the Uniform Crime Reporting Section of the General Services Division in Carson City. The UCR Program, to maintain data quality and uniformity, furnishes to the contributing agencies continuous training and instruction in Uniform Crime Reporting procedures. All contributors are also given data submission guidelines, report forms, and a UCR Guide furnished by the FBI that outlines, in detail, procedures to score and to classify offenses. The guide illustrates and discusses the monthly and annual report forms.

A centralized record system is vital to the sound operation of any law enforcement agency. It is an essential element for crime reporting. Trained UCR personnel at the state level assist contributors in following established reporting procedures.

Law enforcement agencies (state, county and municipal) report the number of offenses that become known to them in the following crime categories:

- 1. Criminal Homicide
 - a. Murder and Non-Negligent Manslaughter
 - b. Manslaughter by Negligence
- 2. Rape
 - a. Rape
 - Attempts to commit rape
- 3. Robbery
 - a. Firearm
 - b. Knife or Cutting Instrument
 - c. Other Dangerous Weapon
 - d. Strong-Arm (Hands, Fists, Feet, etc.)
- 4. Assault
 - a. Firearm
 - b. Knife or Cutting Instrument
 - c. Other Dangerous Weapon
 - d. Hands, Fists, Feet, etc, Aggravated
 - e. Hands, Fists, Feet, Not Aggravated (e.g. Simple Assault)

- Burglary
 - a. Forcible Entry
 - b. Unlawful Entry No Force
 - c. Attempted Forcible Entry
- Larceny-Theft (except motor vehicle theft)
- 7. Motor Vehicle Theft
 - a. Autos
 - b. Trucks and Buses
 - c. Other Vehicles
- 8. Arson

In addition, the agencies submit the number of arrests recorded by sex, age, race and ethnicity for 21 other "Part II" offenses. Descriptions of these offenses are provided under the offense classification section.

Another facet of the UCR Program involves the collection of hate crimes. In 1990, the President of the United States signed into law the "Hate Crime Statistics Act of 1990". In October 2009, the Matthew Shepard and James Byrd, Jr. Hate Crimes Prevention Act amended the Hate Crime Statistics Act. The data identifies crimes that manifest evidence of prejudice based on race, religion, disability, sexual orientation, ethnicity, gender, or gender identity.

Whenever complaints of crime are determined through investigation to be unfounded or false, they are subtracted from the actual count. The number of "actual offenses known" in these crime categories is reported to the Nevada UCR Unit whether or not anyone is arrested for the crime; the stolen property is recovered; prosecution is undertaken; or any other restrictive consideration is in effect.

Other data configurations which contributing agencies tally through the UCR system are as follows:

- -Number of crimes cleared by arrest or exceptional means
- -Number of crimes cleared involving persons under age 18
- -Number of law enforcement officers killed or assaulted
- -Type and value of property stolen and recovered
- -Number of arrests for all criminal acts (except traffic violations), broken out by arrestee age, sex and race
- -Number of sworn and civilian enforcement personnel employed by agency type

HIERARCHY RULE

There is a significance to the order in which the Part I offenses are presented. In cases where more than one offense occurs in an incident, only the highest ranking Part I offense is counted. Three offenses, Arson, Human Trafficking—Commercial Sex Acts, and Human Trafficking—Involuntary Servitude, ignore the Hierarchy Rule and are always counted even in cases when multiple offenses occur in an incident. The Hierarchy Rule, which requires counting only the highest offense on the list and ignoring all others, applies only to crime reporting and does not affect the number of charges for which the defendant may be prosecuted in the courts.

VERIFICATION PROCEDURE

Data uniformity and accuracy is of primary concern under this program. With coverage of approximately 38 reporting jurisdictions within the State of Nevada, the problems with attaining uniformity are apparent. Issuance of instructions and training of personnel within contributing agencies does not complete the role of the UCR Unit. It is standard operating procedure to examine each incoming report for mathematical accuracy and completeness.

Clearance factors, recovery rates, and other elements are scrutinized and changes are suggested to the contributors where needed. In the instance of minor mathematical corrections, the contributing agency is either contacted by mail, fax, telephone, e-mail or in-person visitations made by qualified UCR Program personnel.

The possibility of report duplication requires constant verification through internal consistency checks. If duplication is suspected, the contributing agency is immediately contacted and the matter is resolved in accordance with guidelines. Continual analysis of reports is ongoing to assist contributors, and to maintain the quality necessary for a factual and successful program. In addition, an FBI Quality Assurance Group periodically visits contributors to cooperatively assist in necessary auditing of records and reporting methods.

Regardless of the extent of the quality control process employed by the Uniform Crime Reporting Unit, the accuracy of the data assembled under this program depends on the sincere effort exerted by each contributor to meet the necessary standards of reporting. We are especially grateful to the UCR support staff in each contributing agency for their diligence and persistence, and for their constant attention to reporting policies and procedures.

CLASSIFICATION OF OFFENSES

Uniformity in reporting under the Federal Bureau of Investigation's Uniform Crime Reporting Program is based on the proper classification of offenses reported to or known by the police. The adoption of the National System of Uniform Crime Reporting includes the utilization of the offense classifications of that system. Law enforcement in this state has made accurate application of those classifications in the reports submitted to the Nevada Uniform Crime Reporting Program. In view of the need for compatibility with the National System, "offenses" under the program are not distinguished by designation of "misdemeanors," "felonies" or violations of municipal ordinances. The explanations of offense classifications may vary slightly from language used by those familiar with Nevada State Law. However, the major categories of offense classification remain the same between the national and state level.

PART I OFFENSES

Offense data consists of information that has been extracted from reports of Part I crimes that have come to the attention of Nevada Law Enforcement Agencies. Part I crimes are comprised of the following offenses.

1. CRIMINAL HOMICIDE

1a. Murder and Non-Negligent Manslaughter - The willful (non-negligent) killing of one human being by another.

Includes any death due to a fight, quarrel, argument, assault or commission of a crime.

1b. Manslaughter by Negligence - The killing of another person through gross negligence.

Deaths of persons due to their own negligence, accidental deaths not resulting from gross negligence, and traffic fatalities are not included.

2. RAPE

Note: In 2011, the FBI UCR Program revised the definition of rape for reporting purposes. As the offense is now defined, it is possible to report males and females as rape victims. The former (historical) definition used for rape was: The carnal knowledge of a female forcibly and against her will.

- 2a. Rape-Completed Penetration, no matter how slight, of the vagina or anus with any body part or object, or oral penetration by a sex organ of another person, without the consent of the victim.
- 2b. Rape-Attempts to Commit Rape Assaults and attempts to rape.

3. ROBBERY

The taking or attempting to take anything of value from the care, custody, or control of a person or persons by force of threat of force or violence and/or by putting the victim in fear. Includes all attempts.

- 3a. Gun Includes robberies and attempts in which any firearm is used as a weapon or employed as a means of force to threaten the victim or put the victim in fear. Attempts are included.
- 3b. Knife or Cutting Instrument Includes robberies and attempts in which a knife, broken bottle, razor, ice pick, or other cutting or stabbing instrument is employed as a weapon or as a means of force to threaten the victim or put the victim in fear. Attempts are included.
- 3c. Other Dangerous Weapon Includes robberies in which a club, acid, explosive, brass knuckles, Mace®, pepper spray, stun guns, Tasers®, or other dangerous weapon is employed or its use is threatened. Attempts are included.
- 3d. Strong Arm-Hands, Fists, Feet, etc. Includes muggings and similar offenses in which only personal weapons such as hands, arms, feet, fists and teeth are employed or their use is threatened to deprive the victim of possessions. Attempts are included.

4. AGGRAVATED ASSAULT

An unlawful attack by one person upon another for the purpose of inflicting severe or aggravated bodily injury. This type of assault usually is accompanied by the use of a weapon or by means likely to produce death or great bodily harm.

All assaults will be classified in the following categories excluding assaults with intent to rob or rape.

- 4a. Firearm Includes all assaults and attempted assaults involving the use of any type of firearm (revolvers, automatic pistols, shotguns, zip guns, etc.)
- 4b. Knife or Cutting Instrument Includes assaults wherein weapons such as knives, razors, hatchets, axes, cleavers, scissors, glass, broken bottles, arrows, and ice picks are used as cutting or stabbing objects or their use is threatened.
- 4c. Other Dangerous Weapon Includes assaults resulting from the use or threatened use of any object as a weapon in which serious injury does or could result. The weapons in this category include, but are not limited to, Mace®, pepper spray, clubs, bricks, jack handles, tire irons, bottles, or other blunt instruments used to club or beat victims. Attacks by explosives, acid, lye, poison, scalding, burnings, BB guns, pellet guns, Tasers®, stun guns, etc. are also included in this category.
- 4d. Hands, Fist, Feet, Etc (Aggravated Injury) includes only the attacks using personal weapons such as hands, arms, feet, fists, and teeth, that result in serious or aggravated injury. Reporting agencies are to consider the seriousness of the injury as the primary factor in establishing whether the assault is aggravated or simple. The assault is aggravated if the personal injury is serious, for example, there are broken bones, internal injuries, or stitches required. Conversely, the offense is considered simple assault if the injuries are not serious (abrasions, minor lacerations, or contusions) and require no more than usual first-aid treatment.

5. BURGLARY

Breaking and Entering - Unlawful entry of a structure to commit a felony or theft.

Note: For Uniform Crime Reporting purposes the terms "Burglary" and "Breaking and Entering" are considered synonymous. All such offenses and attempts are scored as burglary. Breaking and Entering of a motor vehicle is classified as a larceny for Uniform Crime Reporting purposes.

The UCR Program classifies offenses locally known as burglary (any degree), unlawful entry with intent to commit a larceny or felony, breaking and entering with intent to commit a larceny, housebreaking, safecracking, and all attempts at these offenses as burglary

- 5a. Forcible Entry All offenses where force of any kind is used to unlawfully enter a structure for the purpose of committing a theft or felony. This definition applies when a thief gains entry by using tools, breaking windows, forcing windows, doors, transoms, or ventilators, cutting screens, walls, or roofs, and where known, using master keys, picks, unauthorized keys, celluloid, a mechanical contrivance of any kind (e.g., a passkey or skeleton key), or other devices that leave no outward mark but are used to force a lock. Agencies also include burglary by concealment inside a building followed by exiting the structure as burglary
- 5b. Unlawful Entry No Force All offenses when access is achieved by use of an unlocked door or window. The element of trespass to the structure is essential in this category, which includes thefts from open garages, open warehouses, open or unlocked dwellings, and open or unlocked common basement areas in apartment houses where entry is achieved by other than the tenant who has lawful access. Any unlawful entry without any evidence of forcible entry.
- 5c. Attempted Forcible Entry This category includes those situations where a forcible entry burglary is attempted but unlawful entry is not achieved.

6. LARCENY-THEFT (except motor vehicle theft)

The unlawful taking, carrying, leading, or riding away of property from the possession or constructive possession of another.

Includes all larcenies and thefts resulting from pocket-picking, purse-snatching, shoplifting, larceny from a motor vehicle, larceny of motor vehicle parts and accessories, theft of bicycles, larceny from buildings, and from coin-operated machines.

7. MOTOR VEHICLE THEFT

The theft or attempted theft of a motor vehicle.

This classification includes the theft or attempted theft of a motor vehicle which, for Uniform Crime Reporting designation, is described as a self-propelled vehicle that runs on the surface of the land and not on rails. Excludes reported offenses where there is a lawful access to the vehicle, such as a family situation or unauthorized use by others with lawful access to the vehicle (chauffeur, employees, etc.) Includes "Joy Riding." Excluded from this category are airplanes, boats, farm equipment and heavy construction vehicles, which are scored in the larceny category.

8. ARSON

Any willful or malicious burning or attempt to burn, with or without intent to defraud, a dwelling house, public building, motor vehicle or aircraft, personal property of another, etc. Arson reports are broken down into Structural, Mobile and Other.

Structural - A permanently fixed house trailer or mobile unit used as an office, residence, or storehouse is considered structural property. Can be residential or nonresidential.

Mobile - Motor vehicles and other mobile property such as trailers, airplanes, boats, etc.

Other – Property such as crops, timber, fences, signs, and merchandise stored outside structures.

PART II OFFENSES

The Part II offenses encompass all other crime classifications outside of those defined as Part I offenses. In November 1932 the national UCR Program adopted a Standard Classification of Offenses for the compilation of criminal statistics. This classification was devised and adopted in order that law enforcement, judicial and penal statistics might be uniformly compiled in terms of a single classification of offenses. The definitions of the Part II offenses that follow include some of the offense titles described in Nevada Revised Statute and in county or municipal code. These titles have been included as descriptive data to aid in determining the offenses that are included or excluded from each classification.

9. OTHER ASSAULTS - SIMPLE, NOT AGGRAVATED

Includes all assaults which do not involve the use of a firearm, knife, cutting instrument, or other dangerous weapon and in which the victim did not sustain serious or aggravated injuries.

Examples of local jurisdiction offense titles that would be included in "other assaults" are:

- A. Culpable negligence
- B. Intimidation
- C. Coercion
- D. Stalking
- E. Hazing
- F. Resisting or obstructing an officer
- G. Minor assault
- H. Attempts to commit any of the above

10. FORGERY AND COUNTERFEITING

The altering, copying, or imitating of something, without authority or right, with the intent to deceive or defraud by passing the copy or thing altered or imitated as that which is original or genuine, or the selling, buying, or possession of an altered, copied, or imitated thing with the intent to deceive or defraud.

In the majority of states, forgery and counterfeiting are treated as allied offenses.

- A. Altering or forging public or other records
- B. Making, altering, forging or counterfeiting bills, notes, drafts, tickets, checks, credit cards, etc.
- C. Forging wills, deeds, bonds, seals, trademarks, etc.
- D. Counterfeiting coins, plates, bank notes, checks, etc.
- E. Possessing or uttering forged or counterfeited instruments
- F. Erasures
- G. Signing the name of another or fictitious person with intent to defraud
- H. Using forged labels
- I. Possession, manufacture, etc., of counterfeiting apparatus
- J. Selling goods with altered, forged, or counterfeited trademarks
- K. All attempts to commit above

11. FRAUD

The intentional perversion of the truth for the purpose of inducing another person or other entity in reliance upon it to part with something of value or to surrender a legal right. Fraudulent conversion and obtaining of money or property by false pretenses.

Fraud involves either the offender receiving a benefit or the victim incurring a detriment. The benefit or detriment could be either "tangible" or "intangible." Intangibles are anything which cannot be perceived by the sense of touch. They can be benefits, e.g., a right or privilege, a promotion, enhanced reputation, or a detriment, e.g., loss of reputation, injured feelings.

Includes:

- A. Bad checks, except forgeries and counterfeiting
- B. False pretenses/swindle/confidence games
- C. Leaving a full-service gas station without paying attendant
- D. Credit card/Automatic Teller Machine fraud

- E. Impersonation
- F. Welfare Fraud
- G. Wire Fraud
- H. Attempts to commit any of the above

12. EMBEZZLEMENT

The unlawful misappropriation or misapplication by an offender to his/her own use or purpose of money, property, or some other thing of value entrusted to his/her care, custody, or control. Attempts are included.

13. STOLEN PROPERTY; BUYING, RECEIVING, POSSESSING

Included in this class are all offenses of buying, receiving, possessing, selling, concealing, or transporting any property with the knowledge that it has been unlawfully taken, as by burglary, embezzlement, fraud, larceny, robbery, etc. Attempts included.

14. VANDALISM

To willfully or maliciously destroy, injure, disfigure, or deface any public or private property, real or personal, without the consent of the owner or person having custody or control by cutting, tearing, breaking, marking, painting, drawing, covering with filth, or any other such means as may be specified by local law. This offense covers a wide range of malicious behavior directed at property, such as cutting auto tires, drawing obscene pictures on public restroom walls, smashing windows, destroying school records, tipping over gravestones, and defacing library books. Reporting agencies include attempts to commit any of the above.

15. WEAPONS; CARRYING, POSSESSING, CONCEALING

The violation of laws or ordinances prohibiting the manufacture, sale, purchase, transportation, possession, concealment, or use of firearms, cutting instruments, explosives, incendiary devices, or other deadly weapons.

This class deals with weapons offenses, regulatory in nature such as:

- A. Manufacture, sale, or possession of deadly weapons
- B. Carrying deadly weapons, concealed or openly
- C. Using, manufacturing, etc., silencers
- D. Furnishing deadly weapons to minors
- E. Aliens possessing deadly weapons
- F. All attempts to commit any of the above

16. PROSTITUTION & COMMERCIALIZED VICE

The unlawful promotion of or participation in sexual activities in exchange for anything of value. To solicit customers or transport persons for prostitution purposes, to own, manage, or operate a dwelling or other establishment for the purpose of providing a place where prostitution is performed, or to otherwise assist or promote prostitution. The William Wilberforce Trafficking Victims Protection Reauthorization Act of 2008 requires the FBI UCR Program to distinguish between incidents of prostitution, assisting or promoting prostitution, and purchasing prostitution.

In accordance with the law, the Part II crime of Prostitution and Commercialized Vice is now distinguished by three subcategories:

- A. Prostitution
- B. Assisting or Promoting Prostitution
- C. Purchasing Prostitution

Included in these categories are:

- Performing/purchasing prostitution
- Keeping a bawdy house, disorderly house, or house of ill fame
- Pandering, procuring, transporting, or detaining women for immoral purposes, etc.
- Attempts to commit any of the above

17. SEX OFFENSES (except rape, prostitution and commercialized vice)

This classification includes offenses against chastity, common decency, morals, and the like.

The ability of the victim to give consent is a professional determination by the law enforcement agency. The age of the victim, of course, plays a critical role in this determination. Individuals do not mature mentally at the same rate. Certainly, no 4-year old is capable of consenting, where victims aged 10 or 12 may need to be assessed within the specific circumstances.

Sexual attacks on males are included in this classification. However, depending on the nature of the crime and the extent of the injury, the offense could be classified as an assault.

This classification includes all sex offenses except rape, prostitution and commercialized vice.

Include in this classification:

- Adultery and fornication
- Buggery
- Incest
- Indecent exposure
- Indecent liberties
- Seduction
- Statutory rape (no force)
- All attempts to commit any of the above

18. DRUG ABUSE VIOLATIONS

The violation of laws prohibiting the production, distribution, and/or use of certain controlled substances. The unlawful cultivation, manufacture, distribution, sale, purchase, use, possession, transportation, or importation of any controlled drug or narcotic substance. Arrests for violations of state and local laws, specifically those relating to the unlawful possession, sale, use, growing, manufacturing, and making of narcotic drugs.

The UCR Program collects information on arrests for drug abuse violations based on the narcotics involved. Agencies include all arrests for violations, including attempts, and subdivide the arrests by differentiating between Sale/Manufacturing and Possession:

SALE / MANUFACTURING

- A. Opium or cocaine and their derivatives (morphine, heroin, codeine)
- B. Marijuana
- C. Synthetic narcotics manufactured narcotics which can cause true drug addiction (demerol, methadones)
- D. Dangerous non-narcotic drugs (barbiturates, benzedrine)

POSSESSION

- E. Opium or cocaine and their derivatives (morphine, heroin, codeine)
- F. Marijuana
- G. Synthetic narcotics manufactured narcotics which can cause true drug addiction (demerol, methadone)
- H. Dangerous non-narcotic drugs (barbiturates, benzedrine)

Includes all attempts to sell, manufacture, or possess any of the above.

19. GAMBLING

To unlawfully bet or wager money or something else of value, assist, promote, or operate a game of chance for money or some other stake, possess or transmit wagering information, manufacture, sell, purchase, possess, or transport gambling equipment, devices, or goods, or tamper with the outcome of a sporting event or contest to gain a gambling advantage.

To unlawfully stake money or something else of value on the happening of an uncertain event or on the ascertainment of a fact in dispute.

To unlawfully operate, promote, or assist in the operation of a game of chance, lottery, or other gambling activity.

To unlawfully manufacture, sell, buy, possess, or transport equipment, devices, and/or goods used for gambling purposes.

To unlawfully alter, meddle in, or otherwise interfere with a sporting contest or event for the purpose of gaining a gambling advantage.

Reporting agencies divide gambling arrests into three categories:

- Bookmaking (horse and sport books)
- Numbers and lottery
- All other (illegal gambling machines, etc.)

20. OFFENSES AGAINST FAMILY & CHILDREN

Unlawful nonviolent acts by a family member (or legal guardian) that threaten the physical, mental, or economic well-being or morals of another family member and that are not classifiable as other offenses, such as assault or sex offenses.

Agencies include in this classification:

- Nonviolent cruelty to other family members
- Nonviolent abuse
- Desertion, abandonment, or nonsupport of a spouse or child
- Neglect or abuse of spouse or child (if injury is serious, score as aggravated assault)
- Nonpayment of alimony
- Attempts to commit any of the above

Note: Not counted are victims of these charges who are taken into custody for their own protection.

21. DRIVING UNDER THE INFLUENCE

Driving or operating a motor vehicle or common carrier while mentally or physically impaired as the result of consuming an alcoholic beverage or using a drug or narcotic.

Agencies include in this classification:

- Operating a motor vehicle while under the influence
- Operating an engine, train, streetcar, boat, etc., while under the influence

22. LIQUOR LAWS

The violation of state or local laws or ordinances prohibiting the manufacture, sale, purchase, transportation, possession, or use of alcoholic beverages, not including driving under the influence and drunkenness.

Agencies include in this classification:

- Manufacturing, sale, transportation, furnishing, possessing, etc., intoxicating liquor
- Maintaining unlawful drinking places
- Bootlegging
- Operating a still
- Furnishing liquor to a minor or intemperate person
- Using a vehicle for illegal transportation of liquor
- Open containers
- Drinking on train or public conveyance
- All attempts to commit any of the above

23. DRUNKENNESS

To drink alcoholic beverages to the extent that one's mental faculties and physical coordination are substantially impaired. Exclude driving under the influence.

Agencies include in this classification:

- Drunkenness
- Drunk and disorderly
- Common or habitual drunkard
- Intoxication

24. DISORDERLY CONDUCT

Any behavior that tends to disturb the public peace or decorum, scandalize the community, or shock the public sense of morality.

Agencies include in this classification:

- Unlawful assembly
- Disturbing the peace
- Disturbing meetings
- Disorderly conduct in state institutions, at court, at fairs, on trains or public conveyances, etc.
- Blasphemy, profanity, and obscene language
- Refusing to assist an officer
- All attempts to commit the above

25. VAGRANCY

The violation of a court order, regulation, ordinance, or law requiring the withdrawal of persons from the streets or other specified areas, prohibiting persons from remaining in an area or place in an idle or aimless manner, or prohibiting persons from going from place to place without visible means of support.

Agencies include in this classification:

- Suspicious Person
- Begging
- Loitering (persons 18 and over)
- Vagabondage

26. ALL OTHER OFFENSES

Included in this class are all other state or local offenses (except traffic violations) not included in offenses 1 through 25.

- Admitting minors to improper places
- Bigamy and polygamy
- Blackmail and extortion
- Bribery
- Combination in restraint of trade; trusts, monopolies
- Contempt of court
- Criminal anarchism
- Criminal syndicalism
- Discrimination, unfair competition
- Kidnapping
- Marriage within prohibited degrees
- Offenses contributing to juvenile delinquency (except as provided for in offenses 1 to 25), such as employment of children in immoral vocations or practices, admitting minors to improper places
- Perjury and subornation of perjury
- Possession, repair, manufacture, etc. of burglar's tools
- Possession of drug paraphernalia

- Possession or sale of obscene literature, pictures, etc.
- Public nuisances
- Riot and rout
- Trespass
- Unlawfully bringing weapons into prisons or hospitals
- Unlawfully bringing drugs or liquor into state prisons, hospitals, etc.; furnishing to convicts
- Unlawful disinterment of the dead and violation of sepulture
- Unlawful use, possession, etc. of explosives
- Violations of state regulatory laws and municipal ordinances
- Violation of quarantine
- All offenses not otherwise classified and all attempts to commit any of the above

27. SUSPICION

While "suspicion" is not an offense, it is the grounds for many arrests in those jurisdictions where the law permits. After examination by law enforcement officers, the prisoner is either formally charged or released. Those formally charged are entered in one of the Part I or Part II offense classes. This class is limited to "suspicion" arrests where persons arrested are released by police.

28. CURFEW AND LOITERING LAWS (persons under 18)

Violations by juveniles of local curfew or loitering ordinances.

29. RUNAWAY (persons under 18)

Limited to juveniles taken into protective custody under the provisions of local statutes.

Although running away does not constitute a criminal offense, agencies should report each handling of a runaway. Handling of runaways from one jurisdiction by another jurisdiction should be counted by the home jurisdiction.

CALCULATION OF RATES

The Uniform Crime Reporting Program provides data for police executives to measure local problems. To facilitate this function, local data must be converted into terms of rates and percentages. Simple formulas are displayed here which may assist in these computations.

CRIME RATES

One of the most meaningful crime statistics is the crime rate. This is the number of offenses per 1,000 inhabitants. This rate can be calculated for any city, town or county.

To compute crime rates, divide the community population by 1,000 and divide the number of offenses in each class by that number. The answer is the number of offenses per 1,000 population and is the crime rate for that particular offense.

Example:

a. Population - 75,000

b. Number of burglaries - 215 Divide: 75,000 by 1,000 = 75.0Divide: 215 by 75.0 = 2.87

The crime rate for burglary is 2.87 per 1,000 inhabitants.

CLEARANCE RATES

The percentage of crimes cleared is obtained by dividing the number of offenses cleared by the number of offenses known. This answer is then multiplied by 100 to get a percentage.

Example:

a. Number of clearances in robbery - 38

b. Number of total robberies - 72 Divide: 38 by 72 = 0.528Multiply: 0.528 by 100 = 52.8

The clearance rate for robbery is 52.8%.

CRIME TREND DATA

Local agencies can compute crime trends for a given offense for their individual agency for a particular period of time.

Example:

- a. Auto thefts in your jurisdiction for July through December last year numbered 21.
- b. Auto thefts in your jurisdiction for July through December this year numbered 29.

Subtract: 29-21 = 8, notice that 8 is an increase over the past year.

Divide: 8 by 21 = 0.38, always divide the difference by the total in the earlier time period.

Multiply: $0.38 \times 100 = 38.0$

Your trend in auto theft is a 38.0% increase for the last six months of this year compared to the last six months of last year.

POLICE EMPLOYEE DATA

Police employee rates are expressed as the number of employees per 1,000 population. To compute this rate, divide the population by 1,000 and divide the number of enforcement employees by this number.

Example:

a. Your jurisdiction's population - 75.000

b. Your agency's number of employees - 102

Divide: 75,000 by 1,000 = 75Divide: 102 by 75 = 1.36

Your employee rate is 1.36 employees per 1,000 population.

PROFILE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA

This profile is presented to provide some general knowledge and facts about the State of Nevada. The information might assist users of this publication in understanding the environment in which reported crime incidence and arrest data occurred.

NEVADA FACTS AND FIGURES

Nevada is the seventh largest state in the United States, covering 109,826 square miles. The state's long western border is shared with California, the most populous state in the Union. On its northern and eastern borders are the states of Oregon, Idaho, Utah, and Arizona. The state's longest distance from the northwest corner to the southern tip is approximately 600 miles. At the widest point it is nearly 350 miles.

Nevada consists of seventeen counties, ranging in size from 153 square miles for the state capitol of Carson City to over 18,000 square miles for Nye County, one of the largest counties in the United States.

The geography of the state consists of rugged desert and mountain terrain, with the highest mountain peak (Boundary Peak in Esmeralda County) having an elevation of 13,146 feet above sea level and the lowest point on the Colorado River having an elevation of 490 feet.

Nevada has a four-season climate, with wide variations between its northern and southern latitudes. Low temperatures in the north can go well below zero in the winter months, while high temperatures in the south can climb well over 100° Fahrenheit in the summer. It is the most arid state in the country, receiving an average of less than ten inches of precipitation annually.

Of Nevada's total land area, 85.3% is controlled by the federal government.

State and local governments control .3% and 1.6% falls under the jurisdiction of 22 American Indian Reservations. The United States military, which has a significant presence, has also reserved large areas.

Nevada's population increased by over 54% between 1980 and 1990 (from 800,508 to 1,236,130), 60.0% from 1990 to 2000 (1,236,130 to 2,065,610) and 37.35% from 2000 to 2014 (2,065,610 to 2,843,301) positioning our state among the highest rates of population growth in the nation for the past several years.

Due to these tremendous long-term increases, several communities have been hard-pressed to provide necessary infrastructures.

Despite this growth, Nevada remains one of the most sparsely populated states, with about 26 people per square mile.

Fully 90.00% of the state's total population is located in the counties of Clark (2,069,450 – 72.78%), Washoe (436,797 – 15.36%) and Carson City (53,969 – 1.90%).

Tourism and gaming are the state's largest industries. The gaming industry generated revenue of \$11,018,688,000 in 2014, down (-1.14%) from 2013 when the revenue was \$11,145,385,723.

The Nevada State Demographer at the University of Nevada, Reno, estimates the following population composition for Nevada in 2014:

One **Motor Vehicle Theft** every 51 minutes, 53 seconds

One **Aggravated Assault** every 50 minutes, 13 seconds

One **Arson** every 21 hours, 44 minutes

This crime clock should be viewed with care. This is the most aggregate representation of our 2014 UCR data and it is designed to convey the annual reported crime experience by showing the relative frequency of occurrence of the Index Offenses. This mode of display should not be taken to imply regularity in the commission of the offenses, but rather, it represents the annual ratio of crime to fixed time intervals.

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CRIME RATE

The Nevada Crime Rate is based on the occurrence of an index offense per 1,000 residents of the state. The crime rate for 2014 was 32.49 per 1,000. The comparable rate for 2013 was 30.46. The state population for 2014 was 2,843,301 per the Nevada State Demographer.

INDEX OFFENSES

Law enforcement reported 92,376 index offenses in 2014, versus the 95,220 reported in 2013. That is a decrease of 2,844 (-2.87%). Nevada's four-year average for index offenses is 92,016 (2011-2014).

VIOLENT CRIMES

Murder, rape, robbery and aggravated assault make up the violent crimes category. Violent crimes as a group increased by 1,695 offenses (10.44%), to 17,936 in 2014, up from 16,241 in 2013. Violent crimes accounted for 19.42% of all reported index crimes (17.06% in 2013). 2014 had a violent crime rate of 6.31 per 1,000 population. Nevada's four-year average for violent crimes is 16,618 (2011-2014).

PROPERTY CRIMES

Burglary, larceny, motor vehicle theft and arson make up the property crimes category. Property crimes as a group decreased by 4,539 offenses (-5.75%) to 74,440 in 2014, down from 78,979 in 2013. Property crimes accounted for 80.58% of all reported index crimes (82.94% in 2013). 2014 had a property crimes rate of 26.18 per 1,000 population. Nevada's four-year average for property crimes is 75,398 (2011-2014).

MURDER

There were 168 murders committed in Nevada in 2014. That is an increase of 9 (5.66%) from 159 reported in 2013. Law enforcement cleared 125 murders in 2014 (74.40%). Nevada's five-year average for homicide offenses is 151 (2010-2014).

RAPE

There were 1,351 rapes and attempted rapes committed in Nevada in 2014. That is an increase of 270 (24.98%) from 2013. There were 1,204 committed rapes and 147 attempted rapes in 2014. Law enforcement cleared 319 incidents of rape in 2014 (23.61%). Nevada's five-year average for rape offenses is 1,041 (2010-2014).

ROBBERY

There were 5,951 robberies in Nevada in 2014. That is an increase of 772 (14.91%) from 2013. Law enforcement cleared 1,556 incidents of robbery in 2014 (26.15%). Nevada's five-year average for robbery offenses is 5,195 (2010-2014).

AGGRAVATED ASSAULT

There were 10,466 aggravated assaults in Nevada in 2014. That is an increase of 644 (6.56%) from 2013. Law enforcement cleared 5,135 incidents of aggravated assault in 2014 (49.06%). Nevada's five-year average for aggravated assault offenses is 10,564 (2010-2014). There were 34,692 simple assaults in Nevada in 2014.

BURGLARY

There were 21,787 burglaries in Nevada in 2014. That is a decrease of 1,126 (-4.91%) from 2013. Law enforcement cleared 2,040 incidents of burglary in 2014 (9.36%). Nevada's five-year average for burglaries is 21,851. \$141,325,550 in property was stolen during burglaries in Nevada in 2014.

LARCENY

There were 42,122 larcenies in Nevada in 2014. That is a decrease of 3,580 (-7.8%) from 2013. Law enforcement cleared 9,355 incidents of larceny in 2014 (22.21%). Nevada's five-year average for larceny is 43,036 (2010-2014). \$98,840,559 in property was stolen during larcenies in Nevada in 2014.

MOTOR VEHICLE THEFT

There were 10,128 motor vehicle thefts in Nevada in 2014. That is an increase of 161 (1.6%) from 2013. Law enforcement cleared 821 incidents of motor vehicle theft in 2014 (8.11%). Nevada's five-year average for motor vehicle theft is 9,947 (2010-2014). \$74,306,603 in property was stolen during motor vehicle thefts in Nevada in 2014.

ARSON

There were 403 arsons in Nevada in 2014. That is an increase of 6 (1.5%) from 2013. Law enforcement cleared 110 incidents of arson in 2014 (27.30%). Nevada's five-year average for arson is 425 (2010-2014). \$3,987,135 in property was destroyed in arsons in Nevada in 2014.

STOLEN & RECOVERED PROPERTY

In 2014 Nevada law enforcement agencies reported \$307,093,586 worth of property stolen during the commission of index crimes. \$20,331,002 in property was recovered (6.62%).

CLEARANCE RATE

Nevada law enforcement agencies cleared 21.07% of all index crimes in 2014, a decrease from the 2013 clearance rate of 22.12%.

ARRESTS

122,897 persons were arrested, summoned or cited in Nevada in 2014. That is a decrease of 9,224 (-6.98%) from 2013. Nevada's arrest rate per 1,000 population in 2014 was 43.23.

POLICE EMPLOYMENT DATA

Statewide there were 5,432 full-time sworn law enforcement officers in Nevada in 2014. That is an increase of 60 from 2013. This is a ratio of 1.91 officers per 1,000 population.

OFFICER ASSAULTS

There were 365 assaults on Nevada law enforcement officers in 2014. That is an increase of 21 over 2013 when there were 344 (6.10%). Law enforcement cleared 314 (86.03%) of these assaults.

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2011-2014 Nevada Index Crimes




For Uniform Crime Reporting purposes, a crime index offense is cleared when a law enforcement agency has identified the offender, there is enough evidence to charge and the offender is actually taken into custody. The arrest of one person can clear several crimes, or several persons may be arrested in the process of clearing one crime.

Crime solutions are also recorded in exceptional circumstances when some elements beyond law enforcement control preclude formal charges against the offender. An offense may be exceptionally cleared when it falls into one of the following categories:

- 1. The offender commits suicide.
- 2. A double murder occurs (two persons kill each other).
- 3. The offender dies after making a confession (dying declaration).
- 4. The offender is killed by law enforcement officers.
- 5. The offender confesses to committing a crime while already in custody for another crime or serving a sentence for another crime.
- 6. The offender is prosecuted in another city for a different crime or the same crime by federal, state or local authorities, and the other juristiction refuses to release the order.
- 7. Another jurisdiction refuses to extradite the offender.
- 8. The victim of a crime refuses to cooperate in the prosecution.
- 9. The offender is prosecuted for a less serious charge than the one for which he was arrested.
- 10. The offender is a juvenile who is handled by a verbal or written notice to the parents in instances involving minor offenses such as petit or simple larceny.

During 2014, 21.07% of reported index crimes in Nevada were cleared, either by arrest or exceptional means, down from 22.12% in 2013. The percentage of violent crimes cleared in Nevada in 2014 was 39.78%, down from 41.10% the previous year, while property crime clearances were 16.56%, down from the 2013 level of 18.21%.



Crime Clock - One Violent Crime Every 29 Minutes and 18 Seconds


Crimes of violence involve the element of personal confrontation between the perpetrator and victim and entail the threat or use of violence. By their very nature, violent crimes (murder, rape, robbery and aggravated assault) are considered more serious than property crimes. The total number indicates only the number of incidents reported to enforcement and does not reflect the number of criminals who committed them or the number of injuries inflicted.

The 2014 violent crime rate in Nevada was 6.31 offenses per 1,000 population. Violent crimes represented 19.42% of all reported index crimes. Enforcement agencies cleared 7,135 violent crimes for a 39.78% clearance rate.


Property crimes include burglary, larceny, motor vehicle theft and arson. These crimes do not involve the threat of violence, but entail property taken from one by another, or the destruction of property by arson. Because arson is the most recent addition to the crime index, to this point in time, the UCR Program has not fully reported it along with the other offenses. The reason for this is not all agencies participating in the UCR Program have consistently reported arson information, thus data reliability is still marginal.

There were 74,440 property crimes reported in 2014 (down by 4,539 or 5.75% from 2013), representing 80.58% of total reported index crimes. Enforcement agencies cleared 12,326 crimes (16.56%) versus 19.06% cleared in 2013. Nevada's property crime rate per 1,000 population in 2014 was 26.18.



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



NOTE: In 2011, the FBI UCR Program revised the definition of rape for reporting purposes. As the offense is now defined, it is possible to report males and females as rape victims.

Rape - penetration, no matter how slight, of the vagina or anus with any body part or object, or oral penetration by a sex organ of another person, without the consent of the victim. This definition includes either gender of victim or offender. Sexual penetration means the penetration, no matter how slight, of the vagina or anus with any body part or object, or oral penetration by a sex organ of another person, or by a sex-related object. This definition also includes instances in which the victim is incapable of giving consent because of temporary or permanent mental or physical incapacity (including due to the influence of drugs or alcohol) or because of age. Physical resistance is not required on the part of the victim to demonstrate lack of consent.

In 2014 Nevada law enforcement was able to clear 23.61% of rapes.





Aggravated assault is defined by the FBI Uniform Crime Reporting program as an unlawful attack by one person upon another for the purpose of inflicting severe or aggravated bodily injury. This type of assault usually is accompanied by the use of a weapon or by means likely to produce death or great bodily harm. Attempts are included since it is not necessary that an injury result when a gun, knife, or other weapon is used which could and probably would result in serious personal injury if the crime is successfully completed.


Not included in this class are simple (non-aggravated) assaults. Simple assaults are non-index offenses, although a record is kept of these assaults. During 2014, there were 34,692 simple assaults reported in Nevada, with a clearance rate of 47.85%.

There were 10,466 aggravated assault offenses reported to Nevada law enforcement in 2014. Nevada law enforcement cleared 5,135 aggravated assault incidents, which is 49.06%



Larcency includes: Pocket-picking, purse-snatching, shoplifting, thefts from motor vehicles, theft of motor vehicle parts and accessories, theft of bicycles, theft from buildings, theft from coin-operated device or machine, etc.





Motor Vehicle Theft, per the FBI Uniform Crime Reporting program is defined as the theft or attempted theft of a motor vehicle. A motor vehicle is defined as a self-propelled vehicle that runs on land surface and not on rails. This includes automobiles, trucks, buses, motor scooters, all-terrain vehicles, snowmobiles, etc. This category does not include farm equipment, bulldozers, or watercraft.

There were 10,128 motor vehicle thefts reported to Nevada law enforcement in 2014. Nevada law enforcement cleared 821 incidents of motor vehicle theft for a clearance rate of 8.11%.





Arson, per the FBI Uniform Crime Reporting Program, is defined as any willful or malicious burning or attempt to burn, with or without intent to defraud, a dwelling house, public building, motor vehicle or aircraft, personal property of another, etc.

There were 403 incidents of arson reported to Nevada law enforcement in 2014. Nevada law enforcement cleared 110 incidents of arson for a clearance rate of 27.30%.



HATE CRIMES



Hate Crimes

On April 23, 1990 Congress passed the Hate Crime Statistics Act. This law requires the United States Attorney General to collect data "about crimes that manifest evidence of prejudice based on race, religion, sexual orientation, or ethnicity." The Attorney General delegated the collection of this data to the FBI, who included it in the Uniform Crime Reporting Program.

The FBI Uniform Crime Reporting Program collects hate crime data regarding criminal offenses motivated, in whole or in part, by the offender's bias against a race, religion, disability, sexual orientation, ethnicity, gender, or gender identity. Due to the difficulty of ascertaining the offender's subjective motivation, bias is to be reported only if investigation reveals sufficient objective facts to lead a reasonable and prudent person to conclude that the offender's actions were motivated, in whole or in part, by bias.

Unlike other Unifom Crime Reporting data, which account for actual reported numbers of definite offenses, hate crime reporting requires subjective opinions regarding sensitive issues. Accurate data collection for hate crime requires proper training of enforcement personnel in incident recognition. Criteria for recognizing and reporting hate crimes have been distributed to all Nevada law enforcement agencies.



STOLEN AND RECOVERED PROPERTY VALUES

There was over \$307 million dollars worth of property reported stolen in Nevada in 2014. This value does not include the value of property damaged due to vandalism, malicious mischief or arson.

Supplementary reports relating to stolen and recovered property provide information on the estimated value of such property. Investigating officers have the obligation to assess the value of property stolen and recovered in each crime index offense.

Officers are guided by the following instructions:

- 1. Use the fair market value for articles that are subject to depreciation because of wear and tear, age, or other factors that cause the value to decrease with use.
- 2. Use the cost to the merchant (wholesale cost) of goods stolen from retail establishments, warehouses, etc. In other words, use the dollar value representing the actual cash loss to the victim without any markup or profit added.
 - 3. Use the victim's evaluation of items such as jewelry, watches, and other similar goods that decrease in value slightly or not at all with use or age.
- 4. Use the replacement cost or actual cash cost to the victim for new or almost new clothes, auto accessories, bicycles, etc.
- 5. Use common sense and good judgment to dictate a fair market value of the stolen items when the victim obviously exaggerates the value of stolen property for insurance or other purposes.





LAW ENFORCEMENT PERSONNEL EMPLOYMENT DATA

The Uniform Crime Reporting Program in Nevada compiles on the number of enforcement personnel statewide as of October 31 of each year. Included are the total number of sworn and civilian support personnel with each agency broken out by gender. Also provided in this section are ratios of police to population.

A wide variety of factors unique to different jurisdictions affect the number of employees utilized by various law enforcement agencies to enable them to fulfill their service requirements. Because of this, persons attempting to make comparisons of population/enforcement personnel ratios between agencies/jurisdictions should do so cautiously. The State of Nevada, especially, with highly transient and seasonal population variations, has enforcement requirements which differ from many other jurisdictions.

Full time law enforcement officers include any sworn personnel that possess full arrest powers and carry a weapon. Their primary duties include responding to routine calls for police service, emergency situations, or crime scenes; performing routine patrol; rendering emergency services, enforcing criminal laws and traffic regulations; and investigating violations of criminal laws and traffic accidents. These employees' salaries are paid from law enforcement funds. In addition, correctional officers and police cadets are only included in the officer counts if they are sworn and possess full arrest powers.

Civilian counts are inclusive of all full-time employees of the agency, i.e., dispatchers, clerks, and meter attendants. These employees' salaries are paid from law enforcement funds. Furthermore, correctional officers or jailers that have no police or arrest powers outside the jail, are counted as civilians as long as their salaries are paid from the funds of the law enforcement agency.

Statewide, there were 5,432 full-time sworn law enforcement officers in 2014. This represents an overall ratio of 1.91 officers per 1,000 Nevada residents.

The total number of full-time civilian support personnel employed statewide in 2014 was 3,446.

2014 ASSAULTS ON LAW ENFORCEMENT PERSONNEL

Assaults on Law Enforcement Officers in 2014

In 2014 there was a total of 365 assaults on law enforcement personnel in Nevada, compared to 344 in 2013.

The ratio of assaults per 100 officers was 6.72.

There were 145 assaults while responding to domestic and other disturbance calls which represents 39.73% of the total or assaults in 2014.


Most assaults on officers involved the use of hands, fists, feet, etc., accounting for 236 incidents or 64.66%.

Personal injury to officers occurred in 93 (25.48%) of the 365 incidents, while 272 (74.52%) escaped injury.

30.14% or 110 of the assaults were aimed at officers who were alone, while 255 (69.86%) involved assisted personnel.

The time period during which the most assaults occurred was between 8pm and 10pm with 49 (13.42%).

Law enforcement cleared 314 (86.03%) of all assaults on personnel.

ARREST DATA

Primarily a gauge of law enforcement's response to crime, arrest counts also provide definitive data concerning the age, sex, race and ethnicity of perpetrators. Arrest practices, policies and enforcement emphases vary from place to place and even within a community from time to time. While the practices for certain unlawful conduct such as drunkenness, disorderly conduct, vagrancy and related violations may differ among agencies, those for robbery, burglary and other serious crime arrests are more likely to be uniform and consistent throughout all jurisdictions. The UCR Program procedures require that an arrest be counted on each separate occasion a person is taken into custody, notified or cited. Annual arrest figures do not measure the number of individuals arrested since one person may be arrested several times during the year for the same or different offenses. For UCR purposes, a juvenile is counted as "arrested" when the circumstances are such that if he or she were an adult an arrest would result, but in fact, there may not have been a formal charge.

Nevada law enforcement reports to UCR in 2014 indicated a total arrest figure of 122,895, down from the 2013 figure of 132,121. The arrest rate per 1,000 in population for the state was 43.23.

Note that the FBI Uniform Crime Reporting program recently expanded their Race and Ethnicity definitions. Nevada law enforcement agencies have begun to collect this expanded data; however, it is still incomplete. Therefore, the total number of persons arrested will not match the total number of Races and Ethnicities reported.



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2014 Protection Order Data

The reporting of the protection order data presented here is collected per the guidelines set forth in Nevada Revised Statute 179A.350.

NRS 179A.350 Creation; contents; prompt entry of information; accessibility; submission of report to Legislature.

- 1. The Repository for Information Concerning Orders for Protection Against Domestic Violence is hereby created within the Central Repository.
- 2. Except as otherwise provided in subsection 4, the Repository for Information Concerning Orders for Protection Against Domestic Violence must contain a complete and systematic record of all temporary and extended orders for protection against domestic violence issued or registered in the State of Nevada, in accordance with regulations adopted by the Director of the Department, including, without limitation, any information received pursuant to NRS 33.095. Information received by the Central Repository pursuant to NRS 33.095 must be entered in the Repository for Information Concerning Orders for Protection Against Domestic Violence not later than 8 hours after it is received by the Central Repository.
- 3. The information in the Repository for Information Concerning Orders for Protection Against Domestic Violence must be accessible by computer at all times to each agency of criminal justice.
- 4. On or before February 15 of each year, the Director of the Department shall submit to the Director of the Legislative Counsel Bureau a written report concerning all temporary and extended orders for protection against domestic violence issued pursuant to NRS 33.020 during the previous calendar year that were transmitted to the Repository for Information Concerning Orders for Protection Against Domestic Violence. The report must include, without limitation, information for each court that issues temporary or extended orders for protection against domestic violence concerning:
- (a) The total number of temporary and extended orders that were granted by the court pursuant to NRS 33.020 during the calendar year to which the report pertains;
 - (b) The number of temporary and extended orders that were granted to women;
 - (c) The number of temporary and extended orders that were granted to men;
 - (d) The number of temporary and extended orders that were vacated or expired;
 - (e) The number of temporary orders that included a grant of temporary custody of a minor child; and
 - (f) The number of temporary and extended orders that were served on the adverse party.
- 5. The information provided pursuant to subsection 4 must include only aggregate information for statistical purposes and must exclude any identifying information relating to a particular person.
- 6. The Repository for Information Concerning Orders for Protection Against Domestic Violence must not contain any information concerning an event that occurred before October 1, 1998.

(Added to NRS by 1997, 1803; A 2007, 2483)

Definitions

The following report will describe and summarize temporary and extended protection orders issued in the State of Nevada. These reports are broken down to show which orders were granted to men and to women. Also included is a listing of those orders that included custody of a minor child and available historic data.

The information contained in this report was gathered using a different methodology than in previous years. Previously the data presented was an aggregate of all protection orders issued including all modifications it may have undergone. However, the new methodology aggregates the total number of Temporary Protection Orders and Extended Protection Orders issued per person. This results in a much lower figure than reported in previous years. For reference, the new methodology has been used to supply historical data from 2010 through 2013 for comparison.

Definitions:

Temporary Protection Orders:

Can be granted within 24 hours of receiving the application and in effect up to 30 days or until scheduled court hearing.

Extended Protection Orders:

Awarded only after a hearing before a judge and in effect for up to one year.

Expired Order:

A Temporary Protection Order or Extended Protection Order that has reached the expiration date and was not extended further.

Vacated Order:

A Temporary Protection Order or Extended Protection Order that was cancelled or dissolved prior to the expiration date.


Any of the above orders can also include a grant of temporary custody of a minor child.

Note that on the graphs you will see gender described as male, female, and unknown. Unknown includes those who entered unknown on the application, or those that did not complete the gender portion of the application.

In Nevada, only Protection Orders granted due to Domestic Violence or Domestic Battery are entered into our state Criminal Justice Information System; therefore, these reports do not include any Protection Orders issued for any other reason (i.e. Stalking, Harassment, etc.).





Temporary Protection Orders Issued Between 1/1/14 and 12/31/14




Extended Temporary Protection Orders Issued Between 1/1/14 and 12/31/14






2014 Protection Orders Issued That Include a Grant of Temporary Custody of a Minor Child


2014 Comparison of Protection Orders Issued and Orders Issued With a Grant of Temporary Custody of a Minor Child



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2014 Domestic Violence Data

The Domestic Violence data presented here is collected per the guidelines set forth in Nevada Revised Statute 171.1227.

NRS 171.1227 Peace officer to submit written report concerning suspected acts of domestic violence; information from reports to be aggregated and forwarded to Central Repository; content of report.

- 1. If a peace officer investigates an act that constitutes domestic violence pursuant to NRS 33.018, the peace officer shall prepare and submit a written report of the investigation to the peace officer's supervisor or to another person designated by the peace officer's supervisor, regardless of whether the peace officer makes an arrest.
- 2. If the peace officer investigates a mutual battery that constitutes domestic violence pursuant to NRS 33.018 and finds that one of the persons involved was the primary physical aggressor, the peace officer shall include in the report:
- (a) The name of the person who was the primary physical aggressor; and
- (b) A description of the evidence which supports the peace officer's finding.
- 3. If the peace officer does not make an arrest, the peace officer shall include in the report the reason the peace officer did not do so.
- 4. The information contained in a report made pursuant to subsections 1 and 2 must be:
 - (a) Aggregated each month; and
- (b) Forwarded by each jurisdiction to the Central Repository for Nevada Records of Criminal History not later than the 15th day of the following month.
- 5. The Director of the Department of Public Safety shall prescribe the form on which the information described in subsection 4 must be reported to the Central Repository. In addition to the information required pursuant to subsections 1 and 2, the form must also require the inclusion of the following information from each report:
 - (a) The gender, age and race of the persons involved;
 - (b) The relationship of the persons involved;
 - (c) The date and time of day of the offense;
 - (d) The number of children present, if any, at the time of the offense;
 - (e) Whether or not an order for protection against domestic violence was in effect at the time of the offense;
 - (f) Whether or not any weapons were used during the commission of the offense;
 - (g) Whether or not any person required medical attention;
- (h) Whether or not any person was given a domestic violence card that contains information about appropriate counseling or other supportive services available in the community in which that person resides;
- (i) Whether or not the primary physical aggressor, if identified, was arrested and, if not, any mitigating circumstances explaining why an arrest was not made; and
 - (j) Whether or not any other person was arrested.

(Added to NRS by 1997, 1533; A 2007, 2482)

Please note that the collection of Race and Ethnicity data for incidents of Domestic Violence is a relatively new addition. Nevada law enforcement agencies have begun to collect this expanded data; however, it is still incomplete. Therefore, the total number of offenders or victims will not necessarily match the total number of races or ethnicities reported. Possible ethnicities are either Hispanic or Non-Hispanic. For the majority of people of Hispanic Ethnicity their Race is White.

NRS 179A.450 Creation; contents; submission of report to Legislature; confidentiality of data.

- The Repository for Information Concerning Crimes Against Older Persons is hereby created within the Central Repository.
- 2. The Repository for Information Concerning Crimes Against Older Persons must contain a complete and systematic record of all reports of the abuse, neglect, exploitation or isolation of older persons in this State. The record must be prepared in a manner approved by the Director of the Department and must include, without limitation, the following information:
 - (a) All incidents that are reported to any entity.
 - (b) All cases that are currently under investigation and the type of such cases.
 - (c) All cases that are referred for prosecution and the type of such cases.
 - (d) All cases in which prosecution is declined or dismissed and any reason for such action.
 - (e) All cases that are prosecuted and the final disposition of such cases.
 - (f) All cases that are resolved by agencies which provide protective services and the type of such cases.
- 3. The Director of the Department shall compile and analyze the data collected pursuant to this section to assess the incidence of the abuse, neglect, exploitation or isolation of older persons.
- 4. On or before July 1 of each year, the Director of the Department shall prepare and submit a report to the Director of the Legislative Counsel Bureau for transmittal to the Legislature that sets forth statistical data on the abuse, neglect, exploitation or isolation of older persons.
- 5. The data acquired pursuant to this section is confidential and must be used only for the purpose of research. The data and findings generated pursuant to this section must not contain information that may reveal the identity of an individual victim or a person accused of the abuse, neglect, exploitation or isolation of older persons.
 - 6. As used in this section:
 - (a) "Abuse" has the meaning ascribed to it in NRS 200.5092.
 - (b) "Exploitation" has the meaning ascribed to it in NRS 200.5092.
 - (c) "Isolation" has the meaning ascribed to it in NRS 200.5092.
 - (d) "Neglect" has the meaning ascribed to it in NRS 200.5092.
 - (e) "Older person" means a person who is 60 years of age or older.





2014 Incidents Reported to Aging & Disability Services by County










