NATIVE AMERICAN RESERVATIONS IN NEVADA

Each year there is a theme for the Crime in Nevada publication. In the past, these have included, missing children, the history of Nevada, historical courthouses and hurricane relief to name a few.

The theme chosen this year is Native American Reservations in Nevada to pay homage to the indigenous people of Nevada; for they were the first people to live in this place we call Nevada. The focus is intended to highlight the proud peoples who have been here thousands of years before the settlers came and those who continue to preserve the heritage of these grand peoples.

The Paiute, Western Shoshone and Washoe tribes are all present in Nevada. Each tribe can and does have many colonies within their ancestral lands.

The population on the reservations and colonies is about 8,200 people, who utilize 1.25 million acres of trust land, which reaches over a region of 100,000 square miles.

Most tribes hold cultural events that preserve their heritage and educate the public of their grand history. To find what events are happening, conduct an Internet search using the name of the specific Reservation or Colony; most have websites with calendars of events and further information on their individual tribe and or colonies.

The following page lists the Reservations and Colonies in Nevada. Websites have been included for those that were available.

Our intent was to recognize the indigenous peoples of Nevada. If we have inadvertently left a reservation off the list we sincerely apologize.

Note: Each crime category is predefined and presented in this report in the order of its established Uniform Crime Reporting hierarchy. Each of the Reservations highlighted at the beginning of each report section were assigned alphabetically. There is no association between any crime category and the respective Reservation highlighted in a particular section.

AUTHORITY

The Sixty-Sixth Session of the 1991 Nevada Legislature created a Uniform Crime Reporting Program within the Central Repository.

NRS 179A.078

Uniform program for reporting crimes; advisory committee to assist in establishing and carrying out program.

NRS 179A.078 Uniform Program for Reporting Crimes: Establishment; purpose. The Director of the Department shall establish within the Central Repository a Uniform Program for Reporting Crimes that is designed to collect statistical data relating to crime or delinquency of children and to facilitate the collection and analysis of statistical data relating to crime at a central location.



INTRODUCTION

The Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) Program is a nationwide cooperative effort of over 17,000 city, county, and state law enforcement agencies voluntarily reporting data on crime. The monthly contributions to Nevada's current program, with 39 local law enforcement agencies reporting full-time, represent a solid foundation in establishing an effective statewide criminal justice information system (CJIS). We invite remaining non-participating local law enforcement agencies to join their peers in this effort and to participate in this important program.

Ideally, UCR data will eventually merge with that of the other major components of the criminal justice system (i.e., prosecutors, courts, and corrections) to form an integrated system for the exchange of vital management information. The availability of such data will enhance law enforcement's proactive response to crime and justice in Nevada. The Nevada Department of Public Safety has administered the UCR Program as a statewide, standardized method of collecting statistics on crime as it is reported to law enforcement. The UCR program also produces a reliable set of criminal statistics for use in law enforcement administration, operation, and management. Additionally, Nevada's statistics are forwarded monthly to the FBI for inclusion in its annual report Crime in the United States.

We hope UCR data will be used over the years as a leading social indicator. With this annual report, Nevada's citizens can look to UCR as the primary information source on the nature and extent of crime in Nevada. Criminologists, sociologists, legislators, state and local planners, the media, and academicians can use the statistics for wide and varied research, planning, as well as for other applications.

CRIME FACTORS

Statistics gathered under the UCR Program are submitted by the participating law enforcement agencies of Nevada and represent a spectrum of crime on statewide, county, and municipal levels. Awareness of the presence of unique variables is necessary if fair and equitable conclusions are to be drawn. These crime-influencing factors are present, to some degree, in every community and their presence affects, in varying degrees, the crime developments of the community. Comparison of crime figures between communities should not be made without first considering individual factors present in each community. Crime, as an outgrowth of society, remains a social problem of grave concern and the police are limited in their role as to its detection and suppression. As stated by the President's Commission on Law Enforcement and Administration of Criminal Justice in its report, The Challenge of Crime in a Free Society, (Page 92):

But the fact that the police deal daily with crime does not mean that they have unlimited power to prevent it, or reduce it, or deter it. The police did not create and cannot resolve the social conditions that stimulate crime. They did not start and cannot stop the convulsive social changes that are taking place in America.

They do not enact the laws that they are required to enforce, nor do they dispose of the criminals they arrest. The police are only one part of the criminal justice system; the government is only one part of society. Insofar as crime is a social phenomenon, crime prevention is the responsibility of every part of society. The criminal process is limited to case-by-case operations, one criminal or one crime at a time.

Following are some conditions that will, by type and volume, affect crime that occurs from place to place.

- --Size and density of community population and the degree of urbanization in the surrounding area
- --Compositions of population with particular reference to youth concentration
- --Economic status of population, median income and job availability
- --Relative stability of population, including commuters, seasonal, and other transient types
- --Modes of transportation and area highway systems
- --Climate, including seasonal weather conditions
- --Cultural conditions such as educational, recreational, and religious characteristics
- --Standards governing appointments to the police force
- --Policies of prosecuting officials, the courts, correctional and parole/probation officials
- --Effective strength of law enforcement agencies
- --Attitude of the public toward reporting crime and participation in the prosecution of offenders
- --The administrative and investigative efficiency of local law enforcement agencies, including the degree of adherence to crime reporting standards
- --Organization and cooperation of adjoining and overlapping police jurisdictions

The primary goal of the UCR program is to identify crime and related problems. Statistics in this publication should not be used to measure or to evaluate workloads and results of individual contributing departments. While most police agencies are collectively viewed as crime-fighting units, considerable independent research shows only a small portion of the workload of many departments is spent fighting crime. Because of other assigned duties, the peculiar cycle of crime and clearances, and different community factors that normally affect crime statistics, no conclusions regarding individual departments should be made without consulting directly with the agency being analyzed.

Crime rates in this publication are based on the resident population of the state and its subdivisions as established and published by the Nevada State Demographer. Population estimates are revised annually. Seasonal population figures are too inaccurate and fluctuate too rapidly to be used in the determination of crime rates. Most Nevada communities experience rather wide seasonal population fluctuations due to the nature of the state's major industries, gaming and tourism. Accordingly, actual crime rates per thousand reported here may appear higher than might be expected for a community of comparable size without substantial fluctuations. This should not deter police administrators from using the data for planning and administrative purposes. Local seasonal population data is available which can be utilized for further statistical refinements.

Additionally, readers are cautioned not to make direct comparisons between crime rates reported for Nevada communities and those of communities of similar size in other states without first carefully analyzing and applying local modifying factors.

POTENTIAL USES OF UCR DATA

The Nevada program is unique among similar state programs as it is dedicated to doing more than just gathering statistics. The program is dedicated to providing statistical support services to its contributors and to produce a variety of reports, or crime profiles, on an as-needed basis. These crime profiles will set the stage for extensive use of the data by police administrators and other criminal justice agencies.

Persons reading this report may ask, "How good are Uniform Crime Reports and how can they be used?" Initial responses that come to mind may be limited, but as the information is examined more closely, many and varied uses are discovered. Foremost is keeping the public informed as to the volume and nature of crime, that they may judge and act accordingly. In actuality, UCR is a multi-faceted vehicle of many uses. Here are a few, but by no means all such uses, as they relate to different groups and agencies.

Law Enforcement Contributors

Administrative information relating to:

- 1. Budget need and justification
- Staffing number needed relating to state average number of employees vs. population and crime rate
- 3. Department composition Patrol, Administration, Jail, Laboratory, Detective Division, Juvenile
- 4. Identification of specific problem crimes

- 5. Disbursement of personnel and shifts in accordance with the crime picture of individual communities with avoidance of duplication of services in cases of concurrent jurisdiction
- 6. Training according to crime problem prioritization
- 7. Equipment procurement by justified need
- 8. Selective enforcement by crime volume, particular times, and seasons through UCR information
- 9. Crime Profiles identification of problems unique to individual communities
- 10. Long-range Planning as anticipated by crime trends

Governor and Legislature

- 1. Broad, accurate picture of crime in Nevada by location, volume, type, and rate, as reported and derived from records of all participating enforcement agencies
- Guide to validate funding needs of special interest groups and their requests for funding of the same
- 3. Need for more or fewer specialized programs
- 4. Identification of crime trends and their relationship(s) to training, courts, corrections, and other criminal justice agencies
- 5. Identification of various social problems relating to drugs, alcohol, juveniles and rehabilitation
- 6. Effectiveness of various social programs related to drugs, alcohol, juveniles and rehabilitation

Courts - Prosecution

- 1. Valuable general research information on crimes within the areas being served
- 2. Crime trend information
- 3. Identification of specific crimes to be considered in the prosecutorial and judicial processes

Press

A factual source for use in reporting crime and socially-related problems

Social Agencies

- 1. Identification of problem areas for concentration of remedial activities
- 2. Application for general evaluation of program effectiveness

Educational Institutions

Educators at all levels can use UCR data for various studies, budget preparation, and planning.

The above listed are a few possible uses; undoubtedly many more exist. The larger the UCR database becomes, the clearer its value will become. Since effective problem solving begins with problem identification, UCR will continue to be meaningful for years to come.

Nevada UCR believes the data provided here can serve as a catalyst for some departments to establish modern record systems for the first time. With other agencies it may spur emplacement of needed system upgrades. This will enable administrators at the chief and sheriff levels to be able to take a renewed look at their departments, potentially effecting beneficial internal operational changes. Awareness by subordinate personnel that their reports and arrest information are being used, not just filed away, will result in better and more comprehensive reporting. Finally, the periodic release of crime information to the general public will keep the crime problem in its proper perspective.

REPORTING PROCEDURE

In Nevada's UCR, contributing law enforcement agencies are wholly responsible for compiling their own crime reports and submitting them to the Uniform Crime Reporting Section of the Records and Technology Division in Carson City. The UCR Program, to maintain data quality and uniformity, furnishes to the contributing agencies continuous training and instruction in Uniform Crime Reporting procedures. All contributors are also given data submission guidelines, report forms, and a UCR Guide furnished by the FBI that outlines, in detail, procedures to score and to classify offenses. The guide illustrates and discusses the monthly and annual report forms.

A centralized record system is vital to the sound operation of any law enforcement agency. It is an essential element for crime reporting. Trained UCR personnel at the state level assist contributors in following established reporting procedures.

Law enforcement agencies (state, county and municipal) report the number of offenses that become known to them in the following crime categories:

1. Criminal Homicide

- a. Murder and Non-Negligent Manslaughter
- b. Manslaughter by Negligence (not an index crime)

2. Forcible Rape

- a. Rape by Force
- b. Attempts to Commit Forcible Rape

3. Robbery

- a. Firearm
- b. Knife or Cutting Instrument
- c. Other Dangerous Weapon
- d. Strong-Arm (Hands, Fists, Feet, etc.)

4. Assault

- a. Firearm
- b. Knife or Cutting Instrument
- c. Other Dangerous Weapon
- d. Hands, Fists, Feet, etc, Aggravated
- e. Hands, Fists, Feet, Not Aggravated (not an index crime)

5. Burglary

- a. Forcible Entry
- b. Unlawful Entry No Force
- c. Attempted Forcible Entry

6. Larceny-Theft (except motor vehicle theft)

7. Motor Vehicle Theft

- a. Autos
- b. Trucks and Buses
- c. Other Vehicles

8. Arson

In addition, the agencies submit the number of arrests recorded, by sex and age, for 21 other "Part II" offenses. Descriptions of these offenses are provided under the offense classification section.

Another facet of the UCR Program involves the collection of "hate crimes." In 1990, the President of the United States signed into law the "Hate Crime Statistics Act of 1990." The data identifies crimes that manifest evidence of prejudice based on race, religion, sexual orientation, ethnicity, and physical or mental disabilities.

Whenever complaints of crime are determined through investigation to be unfounded or false, they are subtracted from the actual count. The number of "actual offenses known" in these crime categories is reported to the Nevada UCR Unit whether or not anyone is arrested for the crime, the stolen property is recovered, prosecution is undertaken, or any other restrictive consideration is in effect.

Other data configurations which contributing agencies tally through the UCR system are as follows:

- --Number of crimes cleared by arrest or exceptional means
- --Number of crimes cleared involving persons under age 18
- --Number of enforcement officers killed or assaulted
- --Type and value of property stolen and recovered

- --Number of arrests for all criminal acts (except traffic violations), broken out by arrestee age, sex and race
- --Number of sworn and civilian enforcement personnel employed by agency type

HIERARCHY RULE

The experience of law enforcement agencies handling UCR data shows that, for the most part, offenses of law occur singly as opposed to many being committed simultaneously. In these single-offense situations, it must be decided whether the crime was one of the Index Offenses, and if so, it is scored accordingly. However, if several offenses are committed at the same time by a person or a group of persons, a different approach must be used in classifying and scoring. As a general rule, a multiple-offense situation requires classification of each of the offenses and identification of those that are Part I crimes. The Part I offenses involved must then be located within their ranked list, which goes from most to least priority. The offense which is highest on the list is scored. The other offenses involved in the incident are ignored. The Hierarchy Rule, which requires counting only the highest offense on the list and ignoring all others, applies only to crime reporting and does not affect the number of charges for which the defendant may be prosecuted in the courts.

VERIFICATION PROCEDURE

Data uniformity and accuracy is of primary concern under this program. With coverage of approximately 39 reporting jurisdictions within the State of Nevada, the problems with attaining uniformity are apparent. Issuance of instructions and training of personnel within contributing agencies does not complete the role of the UCR Unit. It is standard operating procedure to examine each incoming report for mathematical accuracy and completeness.

Clearance factors, recovery rates, and other elements are scrutinized and changes are suggested to the contributors where needed. In the instance of minor mathematical corrections, the contributing agency is either contacted by mail, fax, telephone, e-mail or in-person visitations made by qualified UCR Program personnel.

The possibility of report duplication requires constant verification through internal consistency checks. If duplication is suspected, the contributing agency is immediately contacted and the matter is resolved in accordance with guidelines. Continual analysis of reports is ongoing to assist contributors, and to maintain the quality necessary for a factual and successful program. In addition, an FBI Quality Assurance Group periodically visits contributors to cooperatively assist in necessary auditing of records and reporting methods.

Regardless of the extent of the quality control process employed by the Uniform Crime Reporting Unit, the accuracy of the data assembled under this program depends on the sincere effort exerted by each contributor to meet the necessary standards of reporting. We are especially grateful to the UCR support staff in each contributing agency for their diligence and persistence, and for their constant attention to reporting policies and procedures.

STATEMENT OF POLICY FOR RELEASE OF UCR STATISTICAL INFORMATION

The following policies provide guidance concerning the release of UCR statistical information. Prior to being released, all information is approved by senior UCR staff.

PROFILE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA

This profile is presented to provide some general knowledge and facts about the State of Nevada. The information might assist users of this publication in understanding the environment in which reported crime incidents and arrest data occurred.

NEVADA FACTS AND FIGURES

- ---Nevada is the seventh largest state in the United States, covering 109,826 square miles. The state's long western border is shared with California, the most populous state in the Union. On its northern and eastern borders are the states of Oregon, Idaho, Utah, and Arizona. The state's longest distance from the northwest corner to the southern tip is approximately 600 miles. At the widest point it is nearly 350 miles.
- ---Nevada consists of seventeen counties, ranging in size from 153 square miles for the state capitol of Carson City to over 18,000 square miles for Nye County, one of the largest counties in the United States.
- ---The geography of the state consists of rugged desert and mountain terrain, with the highest mountain peak (Boundary Peak in Esmeralda County) having an elevation of 13,146 feet above sea level and the lowest point on the Colorado River having an elevation of 490 feet.
- ---Nevada has a four-season climate, with wide variations between its northern and southern latitudes. Low temperatures in the north can go well below zero in the winter months, while high temperatures in the south can climb well over 100° Fahrenheit in the summer. It is the most arid state in the country, receiving an average of less than ten inches of precipitation annually.
- ---Of Nevada's total land area, 85.3% is controlled by the federal government. State and local governments control .3% and 1.6% falls under the jurisdiction of 22 American Indian Reservations. The United States military, which has a significant presence, has also reserved large areas.
- ---Nevada's population increased by over 54% between 1980 and 1990 (from 800,508 to 1,236,130), 60.0% from 1990 to 2000 (1,236,130 to 2,065,610) and 31% from 2000 to 2010 (2,065,610 to 2,700,551). Nevada has had one of the fastest rates of growth in the nation for the past several years. Due to these tremendous long-term increases, several communities have been hard-pressed to provide necessary infrastructures. Despite this growth, Nevada remains one of the most sparsely populated states, with about 25 people per square mile. Fully 88% of the state's total population is located in the counties of Clark (1,951,269 72%) and Washoe (421,407–16%).
- ---The Nevada State Demographer-University of Nevada, Reno, estimates the following population composition for Nevada in 2011: White, 59.36%; Hispanic, 25.61%; African Americans, 7.10%; Asian, Pacific Islanders, 6.61%, American Indians, Eskimo, Aluet 1.32%. Age 1-4, 7%, Ages 5-19, 20%, Ages 20-64, 61% and ages 65 and over, 12%. Males, 50.48%, and Females, 49.52%.
- ---Tourism and gaming are the state's largest industries. The gaming industry generated revenue of \$10,701,174,865 in 2011. Approximately 51,372,307 people visited in 2011. These and other interesting statistics are available at www.travelnevada.com/industry/visitor-statistics/. Of concern to Nevada is the rapid spread of gaming to other states and Indian reservations. The Las Vegas area has responded by expanding and building huge "destination" or "theme" resorts, catering to a broader spectrum of interests.
- ---Nevada is the largest gold producer in the United States and ranks in the top ten in the world. The bulk of this mining boom has occurred within the past fifteen years and has primarily taken place in the rural northern part of the state.

The crime clock should be viewed with care. Being the most aggregate representation of UCR data, it is designed to convey the annual reported crime experience by showing the relative frequency of occurrence of the Index Offenses. This mode of display should not be taken to imply regularity in the commission of the offenses; rather, it represents the annual ratio of crime to fixed time intervals.

CRIME IN NEVADA 2011 - HIGHLIGHTS

CRIME RATE

The Nevada Crime Rate is based on the occurrence of an index offense per 1,000 residents of the state. Municipal and county rates are based on their individual populations. The state crime rate for 2011 was 31.5 per 1,000. The comparable rate for 2010 was 33.4. The state population utilized was 2,721,794 the latest available estimate for 2010 from the State Demographer, Bureau of Business and Economic Research, University of Nevada, Reno.

INDEX OFFENSES

Law Enforcement reported 86,172 Index Offenses in 2011, a decrease of 6,823 offenses (7.3%) from the 92,995 offenses reported in 2010. Nevada's ten-year average for total index offenses (2002-2011) was 106,624.

VIOLENT CRIMES

Murder, rape, robbery and aggravated assault make up the "violent crimes" category. Violent crimes as a group decreased by 2,623 offenses from 2010 for a 14% decrease. During 2011 violent crimes totaled 15,662. The 2010 total was 18,285. Violent crimes accounted for 18.2% of all reported Index Crimes (19.7% in 2010) and displayed a crime rate of 5.7 per 1,000 population. Nevada's ten-year average for violent crimes (2002-2011) was 16,588.

PROPERTY CRIMES

Property crimes, consisting of burglary, larceny, motor vehicle theft, and arson decreased in 2011 by 4,200 offenses (5.6%) from 2010. There were 70,510 offenses reported in 2011, with 74,710 reported in 2010. Property crimes accounted for 81.82% of all index crimes in 2011, with a crime rate of 25.7 offenses per 1,000 population. Nevada's ten-year average for property crimes (2002-2011) was 90,036.

MURDER

There were 151 murders committed in Nevada during 2011, down 10 (6%) from the 161 murders reported in 2010. Law enforcement cleared 123 murders this year (81.5%). Nevada's ten-year average for homicide offenses (2002-2011) was 184.

RAPE

Forcible and attempted rapes decreased by 61 (6.4%) during 2011. There were 895 offenses reported to enforcement in 2011, compared to 956 in 2010. Of the total, 756 were actual rapes, while 139 were classified as attempts. Nevada's ten-year average for rape offenses (2002 - 2011) was 991.

ROBBERY

Robberies decreased by 661 offenses (12.5%), from 5,296 in 2010 to 4,635 in 2011. Nevada's ten-year average for robbery offenses (2001-2010) was 5,636.

AGGRAVATED ASSAULT

Nevada law enforcement reported 9,981 aggravated assaults during 2011, an increase of 1,891 (16%) from the 2010 figure of 11,872. In addition, there were 36,737 simple assaults in 2011. Nevada's ten-year average for aggravated assault offenses (2002-2011) was 9,777.

BURGLARY

Burglary decreased in 2011 by 1,914 offenses (8.6%) from the 2010 total of 22,223. The 20,309 burglaries reported in 2011 resulted in property loss totaling \$70,195,586. Burglaries represented 23% of all reported Index Offenses. Nevada's tenyear average for burglary offenses (2002-2011) was 22,589.

LARCENY

The number of larcenies reported in Nevada for 2011 totaled 40,265, a decrease of 1,591 offenses (4%) from the 2010 figure of 41,856. Thefts from buildings represented 19% of all larceny crimes reported. Nevada's ten-year average for larceny-theft offenses (2002-2011) was 48,314.

MOTOR VEHICLE THEFT

The number of motor vehicle thefts reported in Nevada for 2011 totaled 10,179 a decrease of 709 (7%) from the 2010 figure of 9,470.. Nevada's ten-year average for motor vehicles stolen (2002-2011) was 18,512.

ARSON

During 2011 there were 466 arsons reported in Nevada, compared to 452 in 2010. This represents an increase of 3.1%. Estimated property loss from these offenses totaled \$4,358,481. Nevada's ten-year average for arson (2002-2011) was 622.

STOLEN/RECOVERED PROPERTY

During 2011 law enforcement agencies recorded \$170,488,414 worth of property stolen during the commission of index crimes. They were able to recover \$29,263,236 (17.1%).

CLEARANCE RATE

Law enforcement agencies cleared 23.2% of all index crimes in Nevada in 2011, a decrease of 2.2% over 2010. Nationally, 21.7% of all index crimes were cleared in 2010.

ARRESTS

The total number of persons arrested, summoned, or cited by enforcement in 2011, including juveniles and adults, was 154,729 a 3% decrease over the 2010 total of 159,449. Drug arrests by the Department of Public Safety, Investigation Division in 2011 were 517. Nevada's total arrest rate per 1,000 population in 2011 was 55.8. This does not include drug or DUI arrests by the Nevada Highway Patrol.

POLICE EMPLOYMENT DATA

Statewide there were 5,654 full-time sworn law enforcement officers in Nevada in 2011. This represents a ratio of 2.08 officers per 1,000 population. Nationally the average ratio per 1,000 was 2.4 in 2010.

OFFICER ASSAULTS

Nevada law enforcement officers experienced 374 assaults in 2011, a decrease of 84 (18%) from the 458 reported in 2010. Law enforcement cleared 358 (95%) of all assaults on personnel.

DUCK VALLEY INDIAN RESERVATION

The Duck Valley Indian Reservation was established as a homeland for members of both the Shoshone and Paiute tribes of Native Americans and lies directly on the state line between Idaho and Nevada in the western United States. The reservation, which is in the shape of a square, is almost evenly divided in land area between the two states, with the northern 50.2 percent lying in southern Owyhee County, Idaho and the southern 49.8 percent lying in northwestern Elko County, Nevada.

Established: April 16, 1877 – Expanded twice; once on May 4, 1886 and again July 1910.

Farming and Ranching continue to be mainstays for Duck Valley. The Duck Valley Reservation is composed of 289,819 acres held in trust by the United States Government for the use and occupancy of the Shoshone-Paiute Tribes. Included in the total acreage of the Reservation is 22,231 acres of Wetlands. The Shoshone-Paiute Tribes of Duck Valley continue to exist within the original territories of their ancestors.

Important facts:

Historical housing: earthen willow and sagebrush huts

1884: The headmen of the bands successfully resisted forced movement to Fort Hall Reservation in Idaho.

1878: Allied with the Bannock Tribe in the Bannock War and were sent to a prisoner of war camp in Yakima, WA. Survivors returned to their homelands and the reservation was expanded for the first time in 1886.

Farming and Ranching was the mainstay for the people.

1934: Shoshone and Paiute united and formed a tribal government, their constitution and Bylaws were adopted in 1936.

1884-1911: A boarding school was in operation. After this time, 3-day schools were in operation.

1882: The first full time physician was assigned to the reservation.


1897: A one-room infirmary was built to serve the people.

1936: Wildhorse Reservoir was constructed for the Duck Valley Irrigation Project

1956: The reservation school system was consolidated with the Elko County School district.

1976: The Owhyee Community Health Facility was completed.

Sister Reservations are Fort McDermit in Nevada and Ft. Hall in Idaho.




INDEX CRIMES


Nevada Statewide Index Crimes, 2008 - 2011














Crime Clock - One Violent Crime Every 33 Minutes, 34 Seconds

Crimes of violence involve the element of personal confrontation between the perpetrator and victim and entail the threat or use of violence. By their very nature, violent crimes (murder, rape, robbery and aggravated assault) are considered more serious than property crimes. The total number indicates only the number of incidents reported to enforcement and does not reflect the number of criminals who committed them or the number of injuries inflicted.

The 2011 violent crime rate in Nevada was 5.7 offenses per 1,000 population. Violent crimes represented 18.05% of all reported index crimes. Enforcement agencies cleared 6,923 violent crimes for a 44.2% clearance rate.



Crime Clock - One Property Crime Every 7 Minutes, 27 Seconds

Property crimes include burglary, larceny, motor vehicle theft and arson. These crimes do not involve the threat of violence, but entail property taken from one by another, or the destruction of property by arson. Because arson is the most recent addition to the crime index, to this point in time, the UCR Program has not fully reported it along with the other offenses. The reason for this is not all agencies participating in the UCR Program have consistently reported arson information, thus data reliability is still marginal.

There were 70,510 property crimes reported in 2011, representing 81.82% of total reported index crimes. Law enforcement agencies cleared 13,048 (18.5%) of the property offenses. Nevada's property crime rate per 1,000 population in 2011 was 25.

DUCKWATER INDIAN RESERVATION

The Duckwater Shoshones, *Newe* (*Newe* translates to "the people" in the Shoshone language and generally refers to all Shoshones), have occupied central Nevada for centuries. The tribe lived in the valleys during the summer to gather roots and berries and hunt wildlife that congregated near springfed wetlands. In the fall, the Shoshones moved to the mountains to hunt for big game and gather pine nuts.

Duckwater Indian Reservation was established in 1940 and today is home to about 130 tribal members, a grade school, senior center, and health clinic. The Duckwater Shoshone Tribe was awarded the 2010 U.S. Fish and Wildlife Endangered Species Program Recovery Champion Award for restoring critical habitat for and reintroducing the endangered Railroad Valley springfish.

The Duckwater Spring Festival powwow and barbecue is the community's most celebrated gathering. It includes not only the barbeque and powwow but hand games and other events as well. This is a continuation of the traditional summer festivals held by the tribe when the round dance was danced.

Duckwater is located in the central portion of Nevada in Nye County. Most people in the area make their living by ranching, oil drilling and refining or working at Tribal Administration jobs at the Duckwater Shoshone Tribal Offices.


Native American children have the choice to attend the tribally controlled Duckwater Shoshone Elementary School or they can attend the Nye County School District's Duckwater School. Both are k-8 one-room schools. Most students in the 8-12 grades attend Eureka County High School, which is 47 miles north of Duckwater.

Important facts:

Historical housing: they lived in conical-shaped houses, in the winter.

1863: The Treaty of Ruby Valley called for peace between the Shoshone and the settlers and stipulated that no further white settlements would occur. The Western Shoshone did not surrender any land in this treaty.

1934: Under the Indian Reorganization Act, the tribe formed a new government.


Murder and non-negligent manslaughter are described by UCR as the willful (non-negligent) killing of one human being by another, or, if the death is the result of the commission of another criminal act.

Murder--NRS 200.010: "Murder is the unlawful killing of a human being . (1) With malice aforethought, either express or implied. (2) Caused by a controlled substance which was sold, given, traded or otherwise made available to a person in violation of Chapter 453 of NRS." (3) Caused by a violation of NRS 453.3325

Manslaughter--NRS 200.040: (1) "Manslaughter: (a) Is the unlawful killing of a human being, without malice express or implied, and without any mixture of deliberation...(2) Manslaughter must be voluntary, upon a sudden heat of passion, caused by provocation apparently sufficient to make the passion irresistible; or, involuntary, in the commission of an unlawful act without due caution or circumspection. (3) Manslaughter does not include vehicular manslaughter

Included in this publication's count for this offense classification are deaths caused by negligence. Although manslaughter by negligence is recorded on the "offense known to police" form along with murder, it is not considered by the UCR Program to be an index offense. Attempts to murder or assaults to murder are scored as aggravated assaults and not murder.





ELY INDIAN COLONY RESERVATION


The Ely Shoshone Tribe was established in 1931. The tribe acquired its colony in four parts starting with the acquisition of 10 acres in 1934, an 11-acre portion of an Ely subdivision in 1973, 90 acres south of town in 1997, and a large tract (3,500 acres) of former Bureau of Land Management property that is used for ceremonial and recreational purposes.

The Reservation is located near the south side of the city of Ely in south central White Pine County and consists of 104.99 acres. Part of the city of Ely is contained within in the reservation.

The tribe consists of about 500 members, and tribal lands include a preschool, medical clinic, and Silver Sage Travel Center convenience store and gas station. The White Pine Public Museum in Ely contains some artifacts left in the Steptoe Valley by the tribe's ancestors.

The Ely Shoshone Tribe Fandango is a celebration of traditional culture and dance.

Six members from the Ely Shoshone Tribe took part in a display of traditional dance at the 2002 Olympic Winter Games in Salt Lake City.





FORCIBLE RAPE

2011

Crime Clock - One Rape Every 9 Hours, 47 Minutes

Forcible rape, as defined in the UCR Program, is the carnal knowledge of a female forcibly and against her will. Assaults or attempts to commit rape by force or threat of force are also included. Statutory rape (without force) and other sex offenses are excluded.

Sexual Assault--NRS 200.366: (1) "A person who subjects another person to sexual penetration, or who forces another person to make a sexual penetration on himself or another, or on a beast, against the victim's will or under conditions in which the perpetrator knows or should know that the victim is mentally or physically incapable of resisting or understanding the nature of his conduct, is guilty of sexual assault."

Forcible rape differs from other violent crimes in that the victim, in many cases, is reluctant to report the offense to police. The investigation by police, medical examination, court procedure, embarrassment and fear of accompanying stigma all have a deterrent effect on the victim's willingness to make the offense known to police.


Most rapes in Nevada in 2011 occurred during the months of May (98) and April (92) accounting for 190 (21.22%) of the yearly total of 895. While the lowest months were Feb. (58) and Oct. (54).

In 2011 Nevada law enforcement was able to clear 22.12% of forcible rapes



FALLON INDIAN COLONY & RESERVATION

The Fallon Colony and Reservation is located in Churchill County, two miles northeast of Fallon and the reservation is about 12 miles east of Fallon. It sometimes is referred to as the Stillwater Reservation.

The Fallon Reservation was established April 20, 1907 by Authority of the Act of April 30, 1908 (35 Stat. 85). Additional acreage was added to the reservation in 1917 and 1978. The Fallon Colony was established on August 13, 1917 by Departmental Order. Additional acreage was added to the colony in 1958.

The ancestors of Fallon's Paiute-Shoshone Tribe lived around the Stillwater Marshes and Carson Sink area for thousands of years before white settlers entered the region. Their traditional name, *Toi Ticutta*, literally translates to "cattail eaters".

The *Toi Ticutta* acquired their name because of the large role cattails played in their diets, most notably the roots, which were ground into flour and used to make sweet cakes. The 5,500-acre reservation was established in 1907, and the tribe's headquarters are located on the colony in Fallon.

Twelve miles east of town via U.S. Highway 50, Grimes Point Archaeological Area is home to petroglyphs left by the region's ancient inhabitants up to 9,000 years ago. Nearby Hidden Cave was used by these people as a storage area as far back as 9,000 years as well. Relics from the cave, as well as other Paiute and Shoshone artifacts such as cradleboards and arrowheads, are on display at Fallon's Churchill County Museum.



Crime Clock - One Robbery Every 1 Hour, 53 Minutes

Robbery is defined by UCR as "the felonious and forcible taking of the property of another against his will by violence or by putting him in fear." All attempts to rob are included in the UCR report.

Robbery--NRS 200.380: "Robbery is the unlawful taking of personal property from the person of another, or in the presence, against his will, by means of force or violence or fear of injury, immediate or future, to his person or property, or the person or property of a member of his family, or of anyone in his company at the time of the robbery. A taking is by means of force or fear if used to: (a) Obtain or retain possession of the property; (b) Prevent or overcome resistance to the taking; or (c) Facilitate escape. The degree of force used is immaterial if it is used to compel acquiescence to the taking of or escaping with the property. A taking constitutes robbery whenever it appears that, although the taking was fully completed without the knowledge of the person from whom taken, such knowledge was prevented by the use of force or fear."



GOSHUTE INDIAN RESERVATION

There are two federally recognized Goshute tribes today: the Confederated Tribes of the Goshute Reservation and Skull Valley Band of Goshute Indians of Utah of the Skull Valley Indian Reservation.

The Goshute Indian Reservation, about 70 miles south of West Wendover on the Nevada-Utah border, is Nevada's sole colony dedicated to people of Goshute descent. Goshutes—who call themselves "desert people", Kutsipiuti in their native tongue—share many cultural similarities with other Great Basin tribes, especially the Shoshone. The 176-square-mile reservation (about half of which is in Nevada) is technically inhabited by the Shoshone-Goshute Tribe.

In 1863, the tribe agreed to forego their traditional nomadic lifestyle and take up farming near the town of Ibapah, Utah. The Goshute Indian Reservation was established in 1914 and was extended several times in the following 70 years. The reservation's location amid iconic, unspoiled Great Basin country affords the tribe the opportunity to lead guided hunts for antelope, elk, deer, mountain lions, and turkeys.

Traditional arts: beadwork and basketry

Traditional housing: dug out houses built form willow poles and earth, more commonly known as wiki-ups.

18th and 19th centuries: Navaho and Ute slave raiders preyed upon Goshutes

19th century: obtained horses

1855: Mormons moved into Toole Valley

1860's California Volunteers of the Union Army attacked and killed many Goshutes forcing survivors to sign a treaty in which they agreed to end all hostile actions against the whites and allow their travel through their country. The federal government also agreed to pay them \$1,000 a year for 20 years as payment for the destruction of their game.

1863: Treaty signed

1864: Treaty ratified and announced by President Lincoln on January 17, 1865.

Crime Clock - One Aggravated Assault Every 52 Minutes, 32 Seconds

An aggravated assault is an attempt or offer, with unlawful force or violence, to do physical injury to another. This type of assault is usually accompanied by the use of a weapon or other means likely to produce death or serious bodily injury. Attempts are included since it is not necessary that an injury result when a gun, knife, or other weapon is used which could and probably would result in serious personal injury if the crime is successfully completed. Assaults with personal weapons (hands, fists, feet) are scored as aggravated if there is personal injury requiring more than simple first-aid treatment.

Assault--NRS 200.471: (a) "Assault" means: (1) Unlawfully attempting to use physical force against another person; or (2) Intentionally placing another person in reasonable apprehension of immediate bodily harm.

Battery--NRS 200.481: (1) (a) "...means any willful and unlawful use of force or violence upon the person of another."


Not included in this class are simple (non-aggravated) assaults. Simple assaults are non-index offenses, although a record is kept of these assaults on the "Offenses Known to Police" form. During 2011, there were 36,737 simple assaults reported in Nevada, with a clearance rate of 51.5%.

There were 9,981 aggravated assault offenses reported to enforcement in 2011. The range went from 687 in February to 947 in July.

In 2011, Nevada law enforcement cleared 5,245 aggravated assaults (52.55%).



FORT MOJAVE INDIAN RESERVATION

The Fort Mojave Indian Reservation is located along the Colorado River near Needles, California. The Reservation covers nearly 42,000 acres in the tri-state area of Arizona, California, and Nevada. The land is divided into three major segments: 23,669 acres in Mojave County Arizona; 12,633 acres adjacent to Needles, California; and 5,582 acres in Clark County, Nevada.

Mojave Indians are Pipa Aha Macav — "The People By The River". Mojave culture traces the earthly origins of its people to Spirit Mountain, the highest peak in the Newberry Mountains, located northwest of the present reservation inside the Lake Mead National Recreation Area.

Important facts:

16th Century: The Mojaves were the largest concentration of people in the Southwest.

1850: Territory including Arizona was annexed by the United States.

1859: A United States military outpost was established in on the east bank of the Colorado River to give safe passage to American immigrants traveling from east to west. Initially, this outpost was called Camp Colorado, but it was soon renamed Fort Mojave.

1865: The US Government created the Colorado Indian Reservation near Parker, the southern range of the Mojave.

1891: The military camp was closed and the buildings were transformed into a boarding school, which operated until 1930.

1957: The Fort Mohave Constitution was approved and with it the creation of a seven member tribal council.

Ruins of Fort Mojave still exist today as a reminder of the once-troubled historic relationship between Pipa Aha Macav and American civilization. The ruins are located on a bluff overlooking the Colorado River just south of the boundary of present-day Bullhead City.

Burglary, also known as breaking and entering, is "...the unlawful entry or attempted forcible entry of any structure to commit a felony or larceny."


Burglary--NRS 205.060: (1) "A person who, by day or night, enters any house, room, apartment, tenement, shop, warehouse, store, mill, barn, stable, outhouse, or other building, tent, vessel, vehicle, vehicle trailer, semi-trailer or house trailer, airplane, glider, boat or railroad car, with intent to commit grand or petit larceny, assault or battery on any person or any felony, is guilty of burglary."

Incidents of burglary occurred most frequently during the months of January (1,795), and November (1,776).

Of the 20,309 burglaries reported to law enforcement in Nevada in 2011 10.98% were cleared.

Nevada's burglary rate per 1,000 population in 2011 was 8.03. The highest recorded rate for the past fifteen years was in 1997 at 12.38 per 1,000.



FORT MCDERMITT INDIAN RESERVATION


The Fort McDermitt Indian Reservation, near the town of McDermitt on the Nevada-Oregon border and along a section of the Quinn River, is among the state's oldest government-sanctioned sites of Native American relocation.

The Quinn River, which winds through the arid landscape of the reservation, empties into a low point of the basin which forms the valley where McDermitt is located.

The valley of the Quinn River (once known as the Queen's River) was the location of a winter campsite utilized by nomadic Northern Paiutes and a few Western Shoshone even before Anglos came to the area. The McDermitt area was the traditional territory of the Atsa-Kudok-Wa band of Paiute, while to the south, where Winnemucca now lies, were the Sawa-Waktodo.

Originally established as a military outpost and adjacent Paiute and Shoshone camp in 1865, the tract became an official reservation in 1889. The outpost was frequented by Sarah and Chief Winnemucca and others from their family in the late 1800s; Sarah even lived there on several occasions.

The mixed Paiute and Shoshone population at Fort McDermitt spiked in 1878 as natives sought protection during the Bannock War. In this brief struggle, Bannock (a Paiute band "the buffalo eaters"), northern Shoshone, and other northern Paiute, insubordinately left reservations in Idaho and Oregon to escape the famine caused by overcrowding and mismanagement by the Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA). Every June, the reservation and nearby town of McDermitt host the annual Indian Rodeo.


Larceny is the unlawful taking of the property of another with the intent to deprive him of ownership.

Theft--NRS 205.0832: "A person commits theft if, without lawful authority, he knowingly:

- (a) Controls any property of another person with the intent to deprive that person of the property.
- (b) Converts, makes an unauthorized transfer of an interest in, or without authorization controls any property of another person, or uses the services or property of another person entrusted to him or placed in his possession for a limited, authorized period of determined or prescribed duration or for a limited use.
- (c) Obtains real or personal property or the services of another person by a material misrepresentation with intent to deprive that person of the property or services. As used in this subsection, "material misrepresentation" means the use of any pretense, or the making of any promise, representation or statement of present, past or future fact which is fraudulent and which, when used or made, is instrumental in causing the wrongful control or transfer of property or services. The pretense may be verbal or it may be a physical act.
- (d) Comes into control of lost, mislaid or misdelivered property of another person under circumstances providing means of inquiry as to the true owner and appropriates that property to his own use or that of another person without reasonable efforts to notify the true owner.
 - (e) Controls property of another person knowing or having reason to know that the property was stolen.
- (f) Obtains services which he knows are available only for compensation without paying or agreeing to pay compensation or diverts the services of another person to his own benefit or that of another person without lawful authority to do so.
- (g) Takes, destroys, conceals or disposes of property in which another person has a security interest, with intent to defraud that person.
 - (h) Commits any act that is declared to be theft by a specific statute.
- (i) Draws or passes a check, and in exchange obtains property or services, if he knows that the check will not be paid when presented.
- (j) Obtains gasoline or other fuel or automotive products which are available only for compensation without paying or agreeing to pay compensation.



LOVELOCK INDIAN COLONY

The Lovelock Paiute Tribe of the Lovelock Indian Colony is a federally recognized tribe of Northern Paiute Indians in Pershing County, Nevada that was established in 1907 in the Pershing County town of Lovelock.

The Northern Paiutes living near Lovelock were given two acres in 1907 by the U.S. government for a school for their children. They were given an additional 18 acres on which to build homes in 1910.

September 1907: Purchase of two acres for school site

November 1910: Purchase of 18 acres by Authority of the Act of April, 1910

June 1934: Organized under the Indian Reorganization Act (48 Stat. 984) as amended.

March 1968: Constitution and By-Laws of the Lovelock Paiute Tribe approved.

Uniform Crime Reporting defines motor vehicle theft as the larceny or attempted larceny of a motor vehicle, including "joy riding." Excluded from this class is a reported offense where there is lawful access to the vehicle, such as a family situation or unauthorized use by others with lawful access, such as with employees.

Motor vehicles are defined by UCR as self-propelled vehicles that run on the surface of the land and not on rails, such as automobiles, trucks, buses, motorcycles, motor scooters, snowmobiles, ATV's, etc. Not included are farm equipment, construction equipment, airplanes, motorboats.


Motor Vehicle Theft--NRS 205.2715: "(1) Every person who takes and carries away or drives away the vehicle of another without the intent to permanently deprive the owner thereof but without the consent of the owner of such vehicles is guilty of a gross misdemeanor. (2) Every person who is in possession of a vehicle without the consent of the owner of such vehicle may reasonably be inferred to have taken and carried away or driven away the vehicle."

Motor vehicle thefts occurred most frequently during the months of August (907) and July (879). These months collectively accounted for 18.6% (1,786) of 2011's total motor vehicle theft offenses.

Law enforcement cleared 769 (8.12%) of all motor vehicle thefts in Nevada in 2011.



LAS VEGAS PAIUTE COLONY & SNOW MOUNTAIN INDIAN RESERVATION

The springs that led to the birth—and name—of Las Vegas supported the Tudinu (desert people) for generations. In 1911, the Paiutes, who once were free to move around the desert as they wished, were given a 10-acre plot in downtown Las Vegas, establishing the Las Vegas Paiute Colony.

In 1983, the Las Vegas Paiute Tribe was granted the six-square-mile Snow Mountain Indian Reservation northwest of the city by an act of Congress.

The downtown colony is home to Southern Nevada's largest smoke shop, complete with a walk-in humidor. It is Las Vegas' only smoke shop with a drive-thru window. The Las Vegas Paiute Golf Resort on the Snow Mountain Indian Reservation features a 50,000-square-foot clubhouse, a full restaurant and bar and includes the largest golf shop in the state. The reservation is also home to a smoke shop and gas station.

The annual Snow Mountain Powwow, on Memorial Day Weekend, celebrates the culture, music, and dance of the Southern Paiute people.

Arson--NRS 205.005: "Any person shall be deemed to have set fire to a building, structure or any property mentioned in NRS 205.010 to 205.030, inclusive, whenever any part thereof or anything therein shall be scorched, charred or burned."

Nationally, 56,825 arsons were reported by 15,475 agencies in 2010 (the latest figures available). A 5% increase from 2009. The national overall rate of arson per 1000 population was .20. Nationally, the average dollar loss for property damage or destroyed in reported arsons was \$17,612. Arsons involving structures (residential, storage, public, etc) accounted for 45.5% of the total number of arsons reported Nationally.

There were 466 arsons reported in Nevada in 2011, compared to 452 reported in 2010. Nevada's arson rate was .17 per 1,000 population in 2011. The average dollar loss for property damaged or destroyed in reported arsons was \$9,352. Arsons involving structures accounted for 79.62% of the dollar value loss and 78.11% of the number of arsons reported.

In 2011, arson offenses in Nevada occurred most frequently during the months of July (56) and Jan. (51). These months represented 23% of the year's total. Law enforcement cleared 94 (20.80%) of reported arson offenses in 2011.



PYRAMID LAKE INDIAN RESERVATION

Unlike many reservations across the country, Pyramid Lake is one of few that was established on traditional tribal lands. The Pyramid Lake Paiute Tribe has occupied the region and survived from the resources of the lake (according to ancient tribal legend) since the beginning of the tribe's existence.

The Pyramid Lake Paiute Tribes' Reservation is located thirty-five miles northeast of Reno, located in the counties of Washoe, Lyon, and Storey and covers 476,728 acres. Out of this acreage, approximately 112,000 acres cover the surface of a terminal desert lake, Pyramid Lake. Pyramid Lake is one of the most valuable assets of the Tribe and is entirely enclosed within the boundaries of the Reservation. Pyramid Lake is approximately 15 miles long, 11 miles wide, and measures 350 feet at its deepest point.

Fossilized human remains found in the region have been dated to more than 9,000 years old, and barely a spot along its shore—from the Pyramid, Stone Mother, and Marble Bluff on the southeast coast, to the Needles in the north—does not hold spiritual significance to the tribe.

Following much strife brought on by the influx of California Gold Rushers and Comstock Lode miners in the mid-1800s—including the bloody Pyramid Lake War of 1860—the nearly 750-square-mile reservation was created in 1874. Today, about 2,500 tribal members live in the reservation's three towns of Nixon, Sutcliffe, and Wadsworth.

Pyramid Lake's unique "Cui-ui" fish rely on protection from the Pyramid Lake Paiute Tribe. "Cui-ui" are a large species of suckerfish found nowhere else in the world. Another fish found only in a handful of Nevada waterways, the Lahonton Cutthroat Trout, also holds great importance to the Cui-ui Ticutta. These fish that have helped a people survive for generations now depend on those people for their own survival.

In recent decades, the tribe has played a crucial role in protecting both fish, gaining endangered-species status in 1973 for the Cui-ui and continually fighting for water rights to preserve Pyramid Lake's water quality and protect habitat for both species.

Common employment occupations are: service, management, professional, sales and office, farming, fishing, forestry, construction, maintenance, transportation, agriculture, government and ranching.

For Uniform Crime Reporting purposes, a crime index offense is cleared when a law enforcement agency has identified the offender, there is enough evidence to charge him and he is actually taken into custody. The arrest of one person can clear several crimes, or several persons may be arrested in the process of clearing one crime.

Crime solutions are also recorded in exceptional circumstances when some elements beyond law enforcement control preclude formal charges against the offender. An offense may be exceptionally cleared when it falls into one of the following categories:

- 1. The offender commits suicide.
- 2. A double murder occurs (two persons kill each other).
- 3. The offender dies after making a confession (dying declaration).
- 4. The offender is killed by law enforcement officers.
- 5. The offender confesses to committing a crime while already in custody for another crime or serving a sentence for another crime.
- 6. The offender is prosecuted in another city for a different crime or the same crime by federal, state or local authorities, and the other juristiction refuses to release the order.
- 7. Another jurisdiction refuses to extradite the offender.
- 8. The victim of a crime refuses to cooperate in the prosecution.
- 9. The offender is prosecuted for a less serious charge than the one for which he was arrested.
- 10. The offender is a juvenile who is handled by a verbal or written notice to the parents in instances involving minor offenses such as simple larceny.

During 2011, 23.18% of reported index crimes in Nevada were cleared, either by arrest or exceptional means. The percentage of violent crimes cleared in Nevada in 2011 was 44.20% compared to the national 2010 figure of 47.2%. Nevada's property crime clearances were 18.51% compared to the national 2010 level of 18.3% (arson with 18.7% is included separately in the national clearance percentage).

RENO-SPARKS INDIAN COLONY

The Reno-Sparks Indian Colony is comprised of an urban residential colony, the 1,960-acre rural Hungry Valley Community, north of Reno, and five smoke shops in the Truckee Meadows. In addition to their namesake products, the smoke shops also sell traditional tribal jewelry and crafts.

The colony started in the early 1900s as a neighborhood occupied primarily by Northern Paiute, Shoshone, and Washoe who worked in and around Reno.

Under the Indian Reorganization Act of 1934, these people formed a tribal government. The Tribe was later granted land in Hungry Valley for a reservation.

The colony hosts several events, including the nationally acclaimed Numaga Indian Days Powwow at the Hungry Valley Community over Labor Day Weekend, Thanksgiving and Christmas Craft Markets, and the Reno-Sparks Indian Colony New Year's Eve Powwow.

Primarily a gauge of law enforcement's response to crime, arrest counts also provide definitive data concerning the age, sex and race of perpetrators. Arrest practices, policies and enforcement emphases vary from place to place and even within a community from time to time. While the practices for certain unlawful conduct such as drunkenness, disorderly conduct, vagrancy and related violations may differ among agencies, those for robbery, burglary and other serious crime arrests are more likely to be uniform and consistent throughout all jurisdictions. The UCR Program procedures require that an arrest be counted on each separate occasion a person is taken into custody, notified or cited. Annual arrest figures do not measure the number of individuals arrested since one person may be arrested several times during the year for the same or different offenses. For UCR purposes, a juvenile is counted as "arrested" when the circumstances are such that if he or she were an adult an arrest would result, but in fact, there may not have been a formal charge.

Nationwide, law enforcement agencies made an estimated 13.1 million arrests in 2010 (the latest figures available) for all criminal infractions. When the overall arrest volume was related to the total United States population, the rate was 42.6 arrests per 1,000 inhabitants. In Nevada, law enforcement reports to UCR in 2011 indicated a total arrest figure of 154,729. The arrest rate per 1,000 in population for the state was 55.8.



SUMMIT LAKE INDIAN RESERVATION

Remote even by Nevada standards, Summit Lake is almost 40 miles from the nearest paved road. The almost 20-square-mile reservation was established in 1913 and sits between Sheldon National Wildlife Refuge and Black Rock Desert-High Rock Canyon Emigrant Trails National Conservation Area in northwestern Nevada.

The Summit Lake Paiute Tribe—called *Agai Panina Ticutta*, or "Summit Lake fish eaters" in their native language—has about 120 members, many of whom do not live on the reservation due to its remoteness and primitive living conditions. Due to the reservation's fragile ecosystem, most of it is off limits to non-tribal members.


The centerpiece of the reservation, Summit Lake, has been instrumental in the survival of Lahontan Cutthroat Trout, an endangered landlocked species found only in a handful of Great Basin lakes and rivers.

The Summit Lake Paiute Tribe is a federally recognized Indian Tribe and has a government-to-government relationship with the federal government, states, counties and other local governments.

By election on October 24, 1964, the members of the Agai Panina Ticutta (Summit Lake Fish Eaters) Tribe of the Northern Paiute Nation gave up their traditional form of government, and changed the name of the Tribe to the "Summit Lake Paiute Tribe".

The Tribe's Articles of Association were approved by John A. Carver Jr., Acting Secretary of the U.S. Department of the Interior on January 8, 1965.

The Reservation was established on January 14, 1913 by a President's Executive Order which set aside about 5,026 acres in trust for the Tribe. Successive actions have added additional acreage to the Reservation. The total acreage of the Reservation today is about 12,573 acres. 765 acres are allotments held in trust by the federal government for individual tribal members, 40 acres are public domain land, and another 40 acres are owned in fee simple by non-Indians.



HATE CRIMES

Hate Crimes

2011

--It shall be unlawful for any person, maliciously and with specific intent to intimidate, harass, cause physical injury, or damage real or personal property of another person because of that person's race, color, religion, ancestry, or national origin.--

In April 1990, a federal mandate to collect and report hate/bias crimes was passed by Congress.

Unlike other Uniform Crime Reporting data, which account for actual reported numbers of definite offenses, hate crime reporting requires rather subjective opinions regarding sensitive issues. This requires various law enforcement administrators to develop and utilize viable and appropriate responsive policies.

Accurate data collection for hate crime requires proper training of enforcement personnel in incident recognition as well as cooperation and desire of enforcement communities to report these offenses without influence of special interest groups, media and politics.

Criteria for recognizing and reporting hate crimes have been prepared and distributed to all law enforcement agencies in Nevada. Enforcement personnel training is periodically offered by the Nevada UCR Program and the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

Information reported in this category includes the offense in relation to the bias incident, motivation (anti-race, anti-religion, anti-sexual orientation, anti-ethnicity, etc.) and identification of victims' and offenders' sex, race and ethnicity.

TE-MOAK SHOSHONE TRIBE

The Te-Moak Shoshone tribal lands consist of colonies in Battle Mountain, Elko, and Wells, plus South Fork Indian Reservation. The separate colonies, while part of the same tribe, each reflect the variety between different bands of Te-Moak Shoshone. The tribe has about 2,100 members. The bands that make up the Te-Moak Shoshone Tribe refused to relocate to the Duck Valley Reservation when it was established in 1877, forcing the U.S. government to grant them territory closer to their ancestral tribal lands.

The almost 700-acre Battle Mountain Indian Colony was established in 1917.

The Elko Indian Colony was founded in 1918.

The 80-acre Wells Indian Colony was established in 1977, but the Te-Moak Shoshone people had frequented the Humboldt Wells springs near the town for many centuries before Wells was founded in 1868.

Established in 1941, and at more than 20 square miles, South Fork Indian Reservation is the largest tract of Te-Moak Shoshone tribal land in the state.

The Treaty of Ruby Valley in 1863, granted the tribe ownership of much of eastern Nevada. When, nearly a century later, the government agreed to pay \$26 million in compensation, the tribe rejected the offer, insisting on a return of the land instead. For many of the Western Shoshone bands, cattle ranching has served as the main source of income during the 20th century.

At the beginning of the 20th century there was but a single Western Shoshone reservation, located in Duck Valley along the Nevada-Idaho border. The four Nevada colonies that united to form the Te-Moak Tribe of Western Shoshone adopted a constitution in 1938, which was recognized by the federal government.



DRUG AND LIQUOR VIOLATIONS

Due to the nature of the violations, along with exceptional interest and concern by public officials and citizens of Nevada, a special review is provided for drug and alcohol-related arrests. Tables on the following pages display the number and age of people arrested in 2011.

The information provided here should be of interest to social service agencies involved in the study of drugs and alcohol problems in Nevada. The information pinpoints the predominant drug and liquor arrests in Nevada by age and identifies potential problem areas.

Nevada drug arrests for all agencies totaled 17,723 (includes arrests by Nevada Department of Public Safety Investigation Division - NDI). DUI arrests for all agencies totaled 12,511.

Facts revealed by the table on drug violations for county and municipal agencies:

- **83.12%** of juvenile arrests involved possession violations, 16.88% involved sale / manufacturing.
- 83.90% of adult arrests involved possession violations, 16.10% involved sale / manufacturing.
- -- Of the 17,723 drug arrests, 13,936 were male and 3,270 were female.
- -- The age group 21-29 accounted for most drug possession violations at 4,929 (34.19%).
- The age group 21-29 accounted for most drug sales/manufacturing violations at 989 (35.46%).

Facts revealed by the table on liquor violations for county and municipal agencies:

- 95.29% of juvenile arrests involved liquor laws, 4.71% were for driving under the influence (DUI).
- 33.90% of adult arrests involved liquor laws, 66.10% were for driving under the influence (DUI).
- **--** A total of 12,433 adults were arrested for DUI, 78 juveniles were arrested.
- Of 12,511 DUI arrests in 2011, 9,295 were male, 3,216 were female.

Facts revealed by the tables on drug arrests by DPS Investigation Division.

- The age group 21-29 accounted for most NDI drug arrests with 161.
- There were a total of 517 drug arrests .

TIMBISHA SHOHONE TRIBE

The Timbisha Shoshone Tribe received federal recognition in 1983, but the tribe did not receive a land base until November 1, 2000 when the Timbisha Homeland Act was signed into law. The Act transferred more than 7,700 acres of land in California and Nevada to the tribe.

The Timbisha Shoshone ancestral homelands encompass what is known today as Nevada and California, spreading through the counties of Inyo, Kern, San Bernardino and Mono in California and Nye, Mineral and Esmeralda in Nevada.

Important facts:

- 1863: Signed a treaty, known as the Treaty of Ruby Valley; The Western Shoshone people did not cede any land to the US with the treaty.
- 1979: The Indian Claims Commission (ICC) awarded the Western Shoshone 26 million dollars for the territory
- 1983: The tribe received federal recognition. However, the recognition did not come with a formal land base
- 1994: The California Desert Protection Act was signed into law by President Clinton. The Act creates Death Valley National Park, and includes a provision for the Timbisha Shoshone Tribe.
- 2000: The Timbisha Homeland Act was signed into law by President Clinton. The bill provided for the transfer of 7,500 acres of land in California and Nevada into trust for the tribe. This act created the first tribal reservation within a National Park.
- 2004: The Western Shoshone Claims Distribution Act was signed into law.

STOLEN AND RECOVERED PROPERTY VALUES

Supplementary reports relating to stolen and recovered property provide information on the estimated value of such property. Investigating officers have the obligation to assess the value of property stolen and recovered in each crime index offense. Officers are guided by the following instructions:

- 1. Use fair market value for items subject to depreciation
- 2. Use wholesale cost of goods stolen from retail establishments
- 3. Use victim's evaluation of non-depreciable items
- 4. Use cost of replacement to victims for new or almost new items

There was over \$170 million dollars worth of property reported stolen in Nevada during 2011. This value does not include the value of property damaged due to vandalism, malicious mischief or arson. Following are some pertinent facts regarding stolen property in Nevada in 2011:

- Property stolen totaled \$170,488,414
- Property recovered totaled \$29,263,236
- The rate of recovery was 17.16%
- The property type with the highest recovery percentage was motor vehicles at 64.87%
- The average rate of recovery for property stolen excluding motor vehicles was 5.60%
- -- Stolen property, excluding motor vehicles, was valued at \$137,220,415 with \$7,682,744 recovered





WALKER RIVER INDIAN RESERVATION

The Walker River Indian Reservation is located long the Walker River between Yerington and Walker Lake. At the current lake level, the reservation has only a small frontage on Walker Lake. The bulk of the reservation (72.68%) is in Mineral County; however, portions are in Lyon County (14.37%) and Churchill County (12.95%).

The reservation belongs to the Walker River Paiute Tribe, a Northern Paiute tribe. Their Paiute name is Agai-Ticutta. The English translation means "Trout Eaters."

The reservation's land area is 529,970 square miles (1,372.616 km²) and a population of 853 persons was reported at the 2000 census. Schurz is the only town on the reservation. Weber Reservoir, an impoundment of the Walker River, is located upstream of Schurz and provides irrigation water for farms on the reservation. Most of the reservation is cattle range.

1859: land was set aside for "Indian purposes."

1874: The reservation was established.

Wovoka, a Paiute Prophet was from the area, had a vision which entailed the resurrection of the Paiute dead and the removal of whites and their works from North America.

Wovoka performed what became known as the Ghost Dance. Wovoka claimed that performing this dance would reunite the living with the spirits of the dead and bring peace, prosperity, and unity to native peoples throughout the region. The practice swept throughout much of the Western United States, quickly reaching areas of California and Oklahoma and resulted in the Wounded Knee Massacre. As the Ghost Dance spread from its original source, Native American tribes synthesized selective aspects of the ritual with their own beliefs. This process often created change in both the society that integrated it, and in the ritual itself. The Caddo Nation still practices the Ghost Dance today.

Wovoka died in Yerington on September 20, 1932, and is interred in the Paiute Cemetery in the town of Schurz, Nevada.

ENFORCEMENT PERSONNEL EMPLOYMENT DATA

2011

The Uniform Crime Reporting Program in Nevada compiles information on enforcement personnel statewide as of October 31, 2011. Included are the total number of sworn and civilian support personnel with each agency broken out by gender. Also provided in this section are ratios of police to population.

A wide variety of factors unique to different jurisdictions affect the number of employees utilized by various law enforcement agencies to enable them to fulfill their service requirements. Because of this, persons attempting to make comparisons of population/enforcement personnel ratios between agencies/jurisdictions should do so cautiously. The State of Nevada, especially, with highly transient and seasonal population variations, has enforcement requirements which differ from many other jurisdictions.

Usage of the term "full-time sworn", when referring to enforcement personnel, does not necessarily mean they are engaged in what the public generally perceives as "regular" police duties, such as investigations, patrol, deterrence, etc. The number of personnel available for "regular" duties is affected by regulatory, correctional, administrative and special assignments. Consideration of in-house duties and responsibilities should temper comparisons of agencies.

Sworn Personnel

- During 2011, there were 4,145 full-time sworn municipal personnel in Nevada, providing 1.77 officers per 1,000 residents for urban population areas.
- There were 1,046 full-time sworn deputies employed by Nevada's 15 sheriff's departments in 2011, and 484 troopers with the Nevada Highway Patrol. The ratio of enforcement personnel for every 1,000 population in the rural areas was 3.90.
- Statewide, there were 5,654 full-time sworn law enforcement officers in 2011. This represents an overall ratio of 2.08 officers per 1,000 Nevada residents.
- Nationally in 2010, the latest full year of data available, a total of 14,744 city, county and state
 police agencies employed 705,009 full-time officers and 308,599 civilians, who provided services to more than 291 million inhabitants.
- Regionally, the highest ratios of sworn officers to population in 2010 was in the Northeast and Southern states, where there were 2.6 per 1,000 inhabitants. The Midwest had 2.2 and the West had the lowest ratio of 1.7.
- The national rate of full time law enforcement employees (sworn and civilian) per 1,000 inhabitants was 3.4 in 2010, up from 3.0 in 2009.

Civilian Personnel

- Municipal police departments in Nevada in 2011 employed a total of 3,083 full-time civilians.
- Sheriff's departments statewide maintained 480 full-time civilian employees in 2011. The Nevada Highway Patrol employed a total of 425.
- The total number of full-time civilian support personnel employed statewide in 2011 was 3,985.



ASSAULTS ON LAW ENFORCEMENT PERSONNEL 2011

Nevada UCR compiles detailed monthly data regarding the problem of assaults on law enforcement personnel. The following displays more noticeable points on this issue.

Facts - 2011 Assaults

- In 2011 there were a total of 374 assaults on law enforcement personnel in Nevada, compared to 458 in 2010.
- -- The ratio of assaults per 100 officers was 6.12 (8.26 in 2010).
- -- The greatest number of officer assaults occurred while responding to domestic and other disturbance calls--186 or 49.73% of the total. (188 or 41.04% in 2010).
- Most assaults on officers involved the use of hands, fists, feet, etc., accounting for 233 incidents or 62.30% (325 70.96% in 2010).
- Personal injury to officers occurred in 77 (20.6%) of the 374 incidents, while 297 (79.4%) escaped injury.
- 25.3% or 102 of the assaults were aimed at officers who were alone, while 272 (74.7%) involved assisted personnel.
- The time period during which the most assaults occurred was between 2:00 p.m. and 4:00 p.m with 42 (11.23%).
- -- Law enforcement cleared 358 (95.72%) of all assaults on personnel.

WASHOE TRIBE OF NEVADA & CALIFORNIA

The Washoe Tribe of Nevada and California is a federally recognized tribe of Washoe Indians living in California and Nevada. The Tribe is comprised of several communities south and east of Lake Tahoe united under a tribal council. The tribe owns over 64,300 acres (260 km²) in different parcels.

Tribal history extends an estimated 9,000 years in the Lake Tahoe Basin and adjacent east and west slopes and valleys of the Sierra Nevada Mountain Range.

Before occupation, the Washoe people lived a seasonal life of hunting and plant gathering. Summer was spent at Lake Tahoe, and the surrounding environments, hunting, fishing, and collecting medicinal plants, roots, and berries for the winter season. Fall was spent in the Pine Nut Mountains gathering and celebrating the pine nut harvest, a staple food source. Winter and spring found the Tribe in the lower elevations.

1887: The Washoe's lands were broken up into individual allotments and were typically barren with no access to water.

1935: Constitution and by-laws were written.

1936: Gained Federal recognition

1948: The tribe filed before the Indian Commission asking for \$43.8 million for land, fishing and hunting rights, minerals, and timber that had been wrongly taken from the tribe, plus interest accrued since 1863.

1960's: John Henry Dressler helped to form the Inter-Tribal Council of Nevada, a liaison between tribal, state, and federal agencies.

1970: The case was settled and the Washoe Tribe was awarded \$5 million.



CLASSIFICATION OF OFFENSES

CLASSIFICATION OF OFFENSES

Uniformity in reporting under the Nevada Uniform Crime Reporting System is based on the proper classification of offenses reported to or known by the police. The adoption of the National System of Uniform Crime Reporting included the utilization of the offense classifications of that system. Law enforcement in this State has made accurate application of those classifications in the reports submitted to the Nevada Uniform Crime Reporting Program. In view of the need for compatibility with the National System, "offenses" under the program are not distinguished by designation of "misdemeanors", "felonies" or violations of municipal ordinances. The explanations of offense classifications may vary slightly from language used by those familiar with Nevada State Law. However, the major categories of offense classification remain the same between the national and state level.

PART I OFFENSES

Offense data consists of information that has been extracted from reports of Part I crimes that have come to the attention of Nevada Law Enforcement Agencies. In general, Part I crimes are usually reported to law enforcement agencies. Part I crimes are comprised of the following offenses.

1. HOMICIDE

1a. Murder and Non-Negligent Manslaughter - The unlawful killing of a human being with malice aforethought.

General Rule - Any death due to a fight, quarrel, argument, assault or commission of a crime.

1b. Manslaughter by Negligence - The unlawful killing of a human being, by another, through gross negligence.

General Rule - The killing may result from the commission of an unlawful act or from a lawful act performed with gross negligence.

2. FORCIBLE RAPE

2a. Rape by Force - The carnal knowledge of a female forcibly and against her will.

General Rule - Forcible rape of a female, excluding carnal abuse (statutory rape) or other sex offenses.

2b. Attempted Forcible Rape - All assaults and attempts to rape.

3. ROBBERY

The felonious and forcible taking of the property of another, against his will, by violence or by putting him in fear. Includes all attempts.

- 3a. Gun All robberies and attempted robberies involving the use of any type firearm (revolvers, automatic pistols, shotguns, zip guns, rifles, pellet guns, etc.)
- 3b. Knife or Cutting Instrument All robberies and attempted robberies involving the use of cutting or stabbing objects (knife, razor, hatchet, axe, scissors, glass, dagger, ice pick, etc.)
- 3c. Other Dangerous Weapon All robberies or attempted robberies when any other object or thing is used as a weapon. (This includes clubs, bricks, jack handles, explosives, acid, etc.)
- 3d. Strong Arm-Hands, Fists, Feet, etc. All robberies which include mugging and similar offenses where no weapon is used, but strong-arm tactics are employed to deprive the victim of his property. This is limited to hands, arms, fists, feet, etc. As in armed robbery, all attempts are included.

4. ASSAULT

An assault is an attempt or offer, with unlawful force or violence, to do physical injury to another.

General Rule - All assaults will be classified in the following categories excluding assaults with intent to rob or rape.

- 4a. Gun All assaults and attempted assaults involving the use of any type of firearm (revolvers, automatic pistols, shotguns, zip guns, etc.)
- 4b. Knife or Cutting Instrument All assaults and attempted assaults, involving the use of cutting or stabbing objects (knife, razor, hatchet, axe, scissors, glass, dagger, ice pick, etc.)
- 4c. Other Dangerous Weapon All assaults or attempted assaults when any other object or thing is used as a weapon (clubs, bricks, jack handles, explosives, acid, poison, burning, and cases of attempted drowning, etc.)
- 4d. Hands, Fists, Feet, Etc. Aggravated Assaults which are of an aggravated nature when hands, fists, feet, etc., are used. To be classified as aggravated assault, the attack must result in serious injury.

5. BURGLARY

Breaking and Entering - Unlawful entry or attempted forcible entry of any structure to commit a felony or larceny.

Note: For Uniform Crime Reporting purposes the terms "Burglary" and "Breaking and Entering" are considered synonymous. All such offenses and attempts are scored as burglary. Breaking and Entering of a motor vehicle is classified as a larceny for Uniform Crime Reporting purposes.

General Rule - Any unlawful entry or attempted forcible entry of any dwelling house, attached structure, public building, shop, office, factory, storehouse, apartment, house trailer (considered to be a permanent structure), warehouse, mill, barn, camp, other building, ship or railroad car.

- 5a. Forcible Entry All offenses where force of any kind is used to enter unlawfully a locked structure, with intent to steal or commit a felony. This includes entry by use of a master key, celluloid, or other device that leaves no outward mark but is used to open a lock. Concealment inside a building, followed by the breaking out of the structure is also included.
- 5b. Unlawful Entry No Force Any unlawful entry without any evidence of forcible entry.
- 5c. Attempted Forcible Entry When determined that forcible entry has been attempted.

6. LARCENY-THEFT (except auto theft)

The unlawful taking of the property of another with intent to deprive him of ownership.

General Rule - All larcenies and thefts resulting from pocket-picking, purse-snatching, shoplifting, larceny from auto, larceny of auto parts and accessories, theft of bicycles, larceny from buildings, and from coin-operated machines. Any theft that is not a robbery or the result of breaking and entering is included. Embezzlement, larceny by bailee, fraud or bad check cases is excluded.

7. MOTOR VEHICLE THEFT

The larceny or attempted larceny of a motor vehicle.

General Rule - This classification includes the theft or attempted theft of a motor vehicle which, for Uniform Crime Reporting designation, is described as a self- propelled vehicle that runs on the surface of the land and not on rails. Excludes reported offenses where there is a lawful access to the vehicle, such as a family situation or unauthorized use by others with lawful access to the vehicle (chauffeur, employees, etc.) Includes "Joy Riding." Excluded from this category are airplanes, boats, farm equipment and heavy construction vehicles, which are scored in the larceny category.

8. ARSON

The willful or malicious burning to defraud, a dwelling house, church, college, jail, meeting house, public building, or any building, ship or vessel, motor vehicle or aircraft, contents of buildings, personal property of another, goods or chattels, crops, trees, fences, gates, lumber, woods, bogs, marshes, meadows, etc., are scored as arson.

Include all arrests for violations of state laws and municipal ordinances relating to arson and attempted arson.

PART II OFFENSES

The Part II offenses encompass all other crime classifications outside of those defined as Part I offenses. In November 1932, the national UCR Program adopted a Standard Classification of Offenses for the compilation of criminal statistics. This classification was devised and adopted in order that law enforcement, judicial and penal statistics might be uniformly compiled in terms of a single classification of offenses. The definitions of the Part II offenses that follow include some of the offense titles described in NRS and in county or municipal code. These titles have been included as descriptive data to aid in determining the offenses that are included or excluded from each classification.

9. OTHER ASSAULTS

Assaults and attempted assaults where no weapon was used or which did not result in serious or aggravate injury to the victim are included as other assaults.

Examples of local jurisdiction offense titles that would be included in "other assaults" are:

- A. Simple assault
- B. Minor assault
- C. Assault and battery
- D. Injury by culpable negligence
- E. Resisting or obstructing an officer
- F. Intimidation
- G. Coercion
- H. Hazing
- I. Attempts to commit the above

10. FORGERY AND COUNTERFEITING

In the majority of states, forgery and counterfeiting are treated as allied offenses. Placed in this class are all offenses dealing with the making, altering, uttering or possessing, with intent to defraud, anything false in the semblance of that which is true. Including:

- A. Altering or forging public or other records
- B. Making, altering, forging or counterfeiting bills, notes, drafts, tickets, checks, credit cards, etc.
- C. Forging wills, deeds, bonds, seals, trademarks, etc.
- D. Counterfeiting coins, plates, bank notes, checks, etc.
- E. Possessing or uttering forged or counterfeited instruments
- F. Erasures
- G. Signing the name of another or fictitious person with intent to defraud
- H. Using forged labels
- I. Possession, manufacture, etc., of counterfeiting apparatus
- J. Selling goods with altered, forged, or counterfeited trademarks
- K. All attempts to commit above

11. FRAUD

Fraudulent conversion and obtaining money or property by false pretense. Include:

- A. Bad checks, except forgeries or counterfeiting
- B. Confidence games
- C. Leaving full-service gas station without paying attendant
- D. Unauthorized withdrawal of money from an automatic teller machine
- E. Attempts to commit the above

12. EMBEZZLEMENT

Misappropriation or misapplication of money or property entrusted to one's care, custody or control. Attempts are included.

13. STOLEN PROPERTY; BUYING, RECEIVING, POSSESSING

Included in this class are all offenses of buying, receiving, and possessing stolen property, as well as all attempts to commit any of these offenses.

14. VANDALISM

Vandalism consists of the willful or malicious destruction, injury, disfigurement or defacement of any public or private property, real or personal, without consent of the owner or person having custody or control by cutting, tearing, breaking, marking, painting, covering with filth, or any other such means as may be specified by local law. This offense covers a wide range of malicious behavior directed at property, such as: cutting auto tires, drawing obscene pictures on public restrooms walls, smashing windows, destroying school records, tipping over gravestones, defacing library books, etc. Attempts are included.

15. WEAPONS; CARRYING, POSSESSING, CONCEALING

This class deals with weapons offenses, regulatory in nature such as:

- A. Manufacture, sale, or possession of deadly weapons
- B. Carrying deadly weapons, concealed or openly
- C. Using, manufacturing, etc., silencers
- D. Furnishing deadly weapons to minors
- E. Aliens possessing deadly weapons
- F. All attempts to commit any of the above

16. PROSTITUTION & COMMERCIALIZED VICE

Included in this class are sex offenses of a commercialized nature such as:

- A. Prostitution
- B. Keeping a bawdyhouse, disorderly house or house of ill repute
- C. Pandering, procuring, transporting or detaining women for immoral purposes
- D. All attempts to commit the above

17. SEX OFFENSES (except forcible rape, prostitution, commercialized vice)

Includes offenses against chastity, common decency, morals, and the like, such as:

- A. Adultery and fornication
- B. Buggery

- C. Incest
- D. Indecent exposure
- E. Indecent liberties
- F. Seduction
- G. Sodomy or crime against nature
- H. Statutory rape (no force)
- I. All attempts to commit any of the above

18. DRUG ABUSE VIOLATIONS

Drug abuse violation arrests are requested on the basis of the narcotics used. Included are all arrests for violations of state and local ordinances, specifically those relating to the unlawful possession, sale, use, growing, manufacturing and making of narcotic drugs.

SALE / MANUFACTURING

- A. Opium or cocaine and their derivatives (morphine, heroin, codeine)
- B. Marijuana
- Synthetic narcotics manufactured narcotics which can cause true drug addiction (Demerol, Methadones)
- D. Dangerous non-narcotic drugs (barbiturates, Benzedrine)

POSSESSION

- E. Opium or cocaine and their derivatives (morphine, heroin, codeine)
- F. Marijuana
- G. Synthetic narcotics manufactured narcotics which can cause true drug addiction (Demerol, Methadones)
- H. Dangerous non-narcotic drugs (barbiturates, Benzedrine)

Includes all attempts to sell, manufacture, or possess any of the above.

19. GAMBLING

All charges which relate to promoting, permitting or engaging in gambling. To provide a more refined collection of gambling arrests, the following break- downs are furnished:

- A. Bookmaking (horse and sport books)
- B. Numbers and lottery
- C. All other

20. OFFENSES AGAINST FAMILY & CHILDREN

Included are all charges of non-support and neglect of family and children, such as:

- A. Desertion, abandonment, or non-support of spouse or child
- B. Neglect or abuses of spouse or child (if injury is serious, score as aggravated assault)
- C. Non-payment of alimony
- D. All attempts to commit any of the above

Note: Not counted are victims of these charges who are merely taken into custody for their own protection.

21. DRIVING UNDER THE INFLUENCE

This class is limited to the driving or operating of any vehicle while drunk or under the influence of liquor or narcotic drugs. It includes:

- A. Operating a motor vehicle while under the influence
- B. Operating an engine, train, streetcar, boat, etc., while under the influence

22. LIQUOR LAWS

With the exception of "Drunkenness" (offense 23) and "Driving under the Influence" (offense 21), liquor law violations, state or local, are placed in this class, excluding federal violations, It includes:

- A. Manufacturing, sale, transportation, furnishing, possessing, etc., intoxicating liquor
- B. Maintaining unlawful drinking places
- C. Bootlegging
- D. Operating a still
- E. Furnishing liquor to a minor or intemperate person
- F. Using a vehicle for illegal transportation of liquor
- G. Drinking on train or public conveyance
- H. All attempts to commit any of the above

23. DRUNKENNESS

Included in this class are all offenses of drunkenness or intoxication, with the exception of "Driving under the Influence" (offense 21).

- A. Drunkenness
- B. Drunk and disorderly
- C. Common or habitual drunkard
- D. Intoxication

24. DISORDERLY CONDUCT

In this class are placed all charges of committing a breach of the peace. Include:

- A. Affray
- B. Unlawful assembly
- C. Disturbing the peace
- D. Disturbing meetings
- E. Disorderly conduct in state institutions, at court, at fairs, on trains or public conveyances, etc.
- F. Blasphemy, profanity, and obscene language
- G. Desecrating the flag
- H. Refusing to assist an officer
- I. All attempts to commit the above

25. VAGRANCY

Persons prosecuted on the charge of being, "a suspicious person, etc.," are included in this class. Include:

- A. Vagrancy
- B. Begging
- C. Loitering, (persons 18 and over)
- D. Vagabondage

26. ALL OTHER OFFENSES

Included in this class are all other state or local offenses (except traffic violations) not included in offenses 1 through 25.

- A. Admitting minors to improper places
- B. Abduction and compelling to marry
- C. Bigamy and polygamy
- D. Blackmail and extortion

- E. Bribery
- F. Combination in restraint of trade; trusts, monopolies
- G. Contempt of court
- H. Criminal anarchism
- I. Criminal syndicalism
- J. Discrimination, unfair competition
- K. Kidnapping
- L. Marriage within prohibited degrees
- M. Offenses contributing to juvenile delinquency (except as provided for in offenses 1 to 25), such as employment of children in immoral vocations or practices, admitting minors to improper places
- N. Perjury and subornation of perjury
- O. Possession, repair, manufacture, etc. of burglar's tools
- P. Possession of drug paraphernalia
- Q. Possession or sale of obscene literature, pictures, etc.
- R. Public nuisances
- S. Riot and rout
- T. Trespass
- U. Unlawfully bringing weapons into prisons or hospitals
- V. Unlawfully bringing drugs or liquor into state prisons, hospitals, etc.; furnishing to convicts
- W. Unlawful disinterment of the dead and violation of sepulture
- X. Unlawful use, possession, etc. of explosives
- Y. Violations of state regulatory laws and municipal ordinances
- Z. Violation of quarantine
- AA. All offenses not otherwise classified and all attempts to commit any of the above

27. SUSPICION

While "suspicion" is not an offense, it is the grounds for many arrests in those jurisdictions where the law permits. After examination by law enforcement officers, the prisoner is either formally charged or released. Those formally charged are entered in one of the Part I or Part II offense classes. This class is limited to "suspicion" arrests where persons arrested are released by police.

28. CURFEW AND LOITERING LAWS (persons under 18)

Contains all arrests made for violations of local curfew or loitering ordinances where such laws exist.

29. RUNAWAY (persons under 18)

For purposes of the UCR program, reported in this category are apprehensions for protective custody as defined by local statute. Arrests of runaways from one jurisdiction by another agency are counted by the home jurisdiction. Protective custody actions with respect to runaways taken for other jurisdictions are not included.

CALCULATION OF RATES

The Uniform Crime Reporting Program provides data for police executives to measure local problems. To facilitate this function, local data must be converted into terms of rates and percentages. Simple formulas are displayed here which may assist in these computations.

CRIME RATES

One of the most meaningful crime statistics is the crime rate. This is the number of Part I offenses per 1,000 inhabitants. This rate can be calculated for any city, town or county.

To compute crime rates, divide the community population by 1,000 and divide the number of offenses in each class by that number. The answer is the number of offenses per 1,000 population and is the crime rate for that particular offense.

Example:

a. Population - 75,000

b. Number of burglaries - 215
 Divide: 75,000 by 1,000 = 75.0
 Divide: 215 by 75.0 = 2.87

The crime rate for burglary is 2.87 per 1,000 inhabitants.

CLEARANCE RATES

The percentage of crimes cleared is obtained by dividing the number of offenses cleared by the number of offenses known. This answer is then multiplied by 100.

Example:

a. Number of clearances in robbery - 38

b. Number of total robberies - 72
 Divide: 38 by 72 = 0.528
 Multiply: 0.528 by 100 = 52.8

The clearance rate for robbery is 52.8%.

CRIME TREND DATA

Local agencies can compute crime trends for a given offense for their individual agency for a particular period of time.

Example:

a. Auto thefts in your jurisdiction for July through December last year numbered 21.

b. Auto thefts in your jurisdiction for July through December this year numbered 29.

Subtract: 29-21 = 8, notice that 8 is an increase over the past year.

Divide: 8 by 21 = 0.38, always divide the difference by the total in the earlier time period.

Multiply: $0.38 \times 100 = 38.0$

Your trend in auto theft is a 38.0% increase for the last six months of this year compared to the last six months of last year.

POLICE EMPLOYEE DATA

Police employee rates are expressed as the number of employees per 1,000 population. To compute this rate, divide the population by 1,000 and divide the number of enforcement employees by this number.

Example:

a. Your jurisdiction's population - 75,000

b. Your agency's number of employees - 102

Divide: 75,000 by 1,000 = 75 Divide: 102 by 75 = 1.36

Your employee rate is 1.36 employees per 1,000 population.

WINNEMUCCA INDIAN COLONY

The Winnemucca Indian Colony of Nevada is a federally recognized tribe of Northern Paiute and Western Shoshone Indians in western Nevada whose headquarters are located in Winnemucca.

1917/1918 – 320 acres were set aside

1925: An additional 20 acres were purchased

1935: Constitution and by-laws were adopted

1972: The Colony adopted a constitution pursuant to the Indian Reorganization Act.

1986: The Western Nevada Agency of the BIA ("WNA") took control of the Colony's assets and withdrew its recognition of the colonial government

1990: The BIA had recognized a colonial government and returned the Colony's assets.

July 2000: The WNA declared the Colony to be dysfunctional and refused to recognize any colonial government.

December 2000: The Western Regional Office ("WRO")—which manages Nevada, Arizona, and Utah—overruled the WNA, but the BIA has still not recognized any colonial government.

2007: The Inter-Tribal Court of Appeals of Nevada dismissed all appeals.

2010: Thomas R. Wasson declared the Chairman of the Colony.

2010: Lawsuits continue regarding tribal issues.

YERINGTON INDIAN COLONY AND RESERVATION

The Yerington Paiute Tribe of the Yerington Colony and Campbell Ranch is a federally recognized tribe of Northern Paiute Indians in western Nevada.

Their reservation was established in 1916 and 1936 and is 1,653 acres (6.69 km²) large. In 1990, 354 tribal members lived on the reservation. The tribe had 659 enrolled members in 1992.

Recent history:

In 1937, the Yerington Paiute Tribe ratified its constitution and bylaws. They gained federal recognition under the 1934 Indian Reorganization Act.

The Yerington Paiute Tribe of Nevada's tribal headquarters is located in Yerington, Nevada.

Awarded only after a hearing before a judge and in effect for up to one year.


Modified Extended Protection Orders:

These are extended protection orders that have been modified by the courts since their original issuing.



YOMBA INDIAN RESERVATION

The Yomba Indian Reservation in the upper Reese River Valley was established in 1937 for the Yomba Shoshone Tribe. The 4,700-acre reservation is about 55 miles south of Austin on the western flanks of the Toiyabe Range in Barrett Canyon.

The Yomba Reservation occupies 4,718.46 acres (19.0949 km²) in Nye County, Nevada. The reservation is divided into two districts: the Upper, including Doyle Ranch, and Lower, including Bowler Ranch.

They ratified their constitution on December 20, 1939, under the 1934 Indian Reorganization Act.



CRIMES COMMITTED AGAINST OLDER PERSONS

Crimes Committed Against Older Persons

AB 226 was passed in the 2007 Legislature which requires the Records and Technology Division to compile statistics reporting all crimes committed against older persons in the State of Nevada. For this report an older person is defined as a person 60 years and older. This report is broken into two distinctive parts; the first is from law enforcement agencies reporting incidents involving older persons and the second is from the Division of Aging Services which investigates incidents against older persons as well as non criminal issues such as self neglect.
