NCJIS Disposition Subcommittee Recommendations

Below is the disposition reporting recommendations outlining objectives for the NCJIS Advisory Committee's consideration at the July 9 meeting.

- 1. Report monitoring by DPS/GSD Fingerprint Support Criminal Records Unit
 - a. Track dispositions received or not received by courts and prosecution.
 - b. Track issues & errors
 - c. Provide exceptions report of identified unknown issues
 - d. Provide exceptions report of errors
 - e. Provide exception report of trends
 - f. Establish baseline requirements
 - g. Notify contributors of exception reports as they relate to them
- 2. Standardize forms and guidelines to be developed by DPS/GSD Fingerprint Support Criminal Records Unit.
 - a. To provide standard forms, format and guidelines for all criminal justice agencies
 - b. Improve data reporting and consistency of what is reported
 - c. Increases successful data collection, accuracy and completeness of the State Of Nevada criminal history data base
 - d. Establishes baseline for transition to electronic processing
- 3. Continued outreach and training by DPS/GSD
 - a. To keep criminal justice agencies informed of Criminal History requirements, standards, changes etc...
 - b. Ensures/reinforces requirements are being met
- 4. Utilize alternate funding sources to improve disposition reporting.
 - a. DPS and AOC to identify additional funding resources such as a grant to aid the courts with fixing the issues identified from the actions above, for example technology improvements, interfaces etc...
- 5. Cooperative effort to create electronic reporting of dispositions
 - a. State (Executive, Legislative, Judicial, Department) and Local agencies to work together collectively to establish a electronic reporting mechanism (similar to livescan of arrest records).
